#### The Project

The Willingdon Lands is a 40-acre parcel located at the corner of Willingdon Avenue and Canada Way, West of BCIT. The site is currently envisioned to be a dynamic mixed-use community with a strong employment base.

#### Scope

The partnership is looking to engage a Public Art Consultant as part of the Rezoning Process with the City of Burnaby. The Art Consultant will be responsible for guiding the project in satisfying the partnership's and the City of Burnaby's requirements for Public Art on the site.

This will include but is not limited to:

- Establishing protocols and procedures to determine artist selection.
- Working with the selected artist and liaising with the Partnership and Aquilini Development to facilitate their work.
- Developing and assisting with the creation and execution of an Artist Contract.
- Supporting the artist from selection through installation.

Human Resources has recently transitioned to using an HR Implementation System. The application process has moved onto Dayforce Ceridian, so applying has never been easier!





MOA's Visual + Material Culture Seminar Series



MOA Minds: Watch the Latest Episode



# **Musqueam Creek Surface Water Monitoring**

The Musqueam creek remains closed, since 2019, due to E.coli and Fecal contamination in the water that is a danger to humans and pets.

Animal and human fecal contamination should not exceed 200 E. Coli per 100 milliliters of water, according to Vancouver Coastal Health.

Due to the pandemic, the Creek monitoring didn't occur, and Musqueam Lands Dept. is working to revive the creek monitoring work, as a top priority, with support of Indigenous Services Canada (formerly INAC), to determine the sources of the contamination leaching into Musqueam Creek.
