Human Resources has recently transitioned to using an HR Implementation System. The application process has moved onto Dayforce Ceridian, so applying has never been easier!



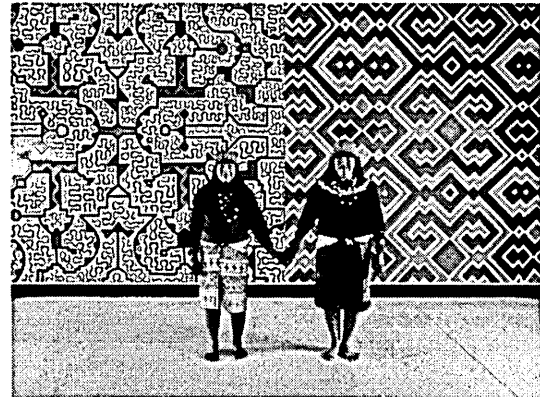

*MOA Minds* is a video series that shares the different voices and perspectives that create an environment that simultaneously preserves the past, celebrates the present, and helps pave the path into the future.

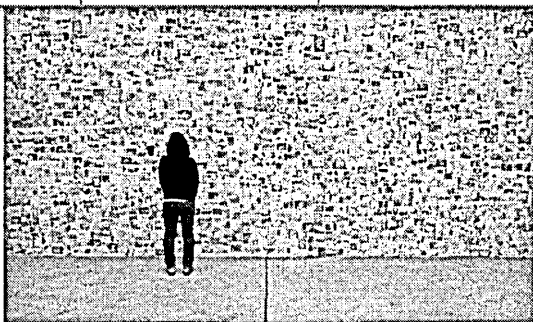

### **Creek Closed for Ceremonial Baths**

#### **Musqueam Creek Surface Water Monitoring**

The Musqueam creek remains closed, since 2019, due to E.coli and Fecal contamination in the water that is a danger to humans and pets.

Animal and human fecal contamination should not exceed 200 E. Coli per 100 milliliters of water, according to Vancouver Coastal Health.

Due to the pandemic, the Creek monitoring didn't occur, and Musqueam Lands Dept. is working to revive the creek monitoring work, as a top priority, with support of Indigenous Services Canada (formerly INAC), to determine the sources of the contamination leaching into Musqueam Creek.
