Energy Conservation Assistance Program

Musqueam housing department is working with BC Hydro and Fortis BC to bring the Energy Conservation Assistance Program (ECAP) to the community.

What is included in the ECAP?

- FREE home energy evaluation: An evaluator will work with you to find simple ways to improve your home's energy efficiency at NO COST to you.
- FREE Energy upgrades: They will identify the best opportunities for savings, and install products like LED light bulbs, water-efficient showerheads and faucet aerators, exterior door weather stripping, and hot water pipe insulation.
- Some Homes may even qualify for an ENERGY STAR® certified fridge or high efficiency gas furnace installation at NO COST.

You are eligible for the ECAP if:

- You live in a home on Musqueam reserve,
- You have a BC Hydro or Fortis BC residential account in your name,
- You have not received the ECAP service in 2013 and 2017.

To receive the service, please fill the ECAP application form. If you have a BC Hydro and a Fortis BC account, fill both sections of the application. Please drop the filled application at the reception in the band office. We will collect the forms and submit them on your behalf.

How the ECAP works?

- 1. You can sign the application form and drop it at the admin office or fill it on your computer and send it to ehaghi@musqueam.bc.ca.
- 2. We will submit the forms on your behalf.
- 3. You will receive a call to arrange a home visit.
- 4. The energy assessor visits your home. They will install energy-efficient equipment at your home and provide you with tips on how to save energy. The visit takes 1.5-2 hours. Here are some of the typical products you may receive:
 - LED light bulbs
 - High-efficiency showerheads and faucet aerators
 - Door weatherstripping
 - Clothes drying rack or clothesline
 - LED nightlight
- 5. After the initial visit, you may receive a call about more advanced products such as a new fridge or furnace, if eligible.

Notes:

- ✓ This program is completely free. You only need to sign the application form.
- ✓ About 100 Musqueam homes have received the service in the past. All other homes that have not received the service in 2013 and 2017 are eligible for this round.
