My name is Ehsan Haghi and I am the Community Energy Specialist at Musqueam Indian Band. I am going to share tips on how we can maintain our homes more effectively and reduce our hydro and gas bills. Today, we are focusing on mold and moisture:

Homes today are more airtight than houses of the past. As a result, moisture can build up inside, especially during winter when windows are kept closed. Dampness, mold growth on walls and heavy condensation on windows are signs of too much moisture. Over time, this excess wetness can cause poor air quality and damage the structure of a home. Multiple sources add moisture to your house. Table below shows how everyday activities add moisture to a house for a family of four.

Activity	Moisture produced (Liter)
Cooking – three meals daily for one week	6.3
Bathing – 0.2 L per shower	2.4
Clothes washing (per week)	1.8
Floor mopping	1.3
Normal respiration and skin evaporation	38.0
from occupants	
Total moisture production per week	49.8

Consider reducing added moisture to your house by measures such as using lids on pots when cooking. In addition to everyday activities, water leaks are a source of moisture in your house and need to be fixed immediately. Moreover, there are other suggestion you may follow to reduce moisture in your house:

Check your humidifier

If your furnace has a humidifier, set it lower to reduce humidity levels. Don't run your humidifier if you already have high humidity levels in your house. If your house feels dense and moist, curtains and pillows feel damp, or condensation is building up on windows or window sills it means you have high humidity levels.

Ventilate

Make sure exhaust fans are installed in bathrooms and kitchens, and make sure the fans vent directly to the outside. Run your bathroom fan for a minimum of 20 minutes after taking a shower, to allow for the removal of excess humidity and moisture. Bathroom fans are crucial in controlling moisture in your home. Bathroom fans exhaust excess moisture, humidity, odors and other pollutants in your bathroom. The bathroom fan also helps to remove water vapor accumulated on mirrors and walls.

Keep moisture out of your house

Cover exposed earth floors in basements and crawl spaces with moisture barriers. Install a sump pump to remove excess moisture under the foundation. Fix water leaks in the basement. Make sure the grading slopes away from your house so water does not flow towards the foundation. Ensure eaves troughs adequately divert water away from your home.

Vent your dryer to the outside

Make sure your dryer is vented to outside the house and not the inside. For every load of laundry you do, you are allowing two gallons of water into your house. That is an amazing amount of moisture you are introducing to your home that could lead to mold growth.

Are you interested in receiving an energy assessment of your house as well as FREE energy saving products including LED lamps, weather stripping, and watersaving showerheads?? Musqueam housing department is working with BC Hydro and Fortis BC to bring the Energy Conservation Assistance Program (ECAP) to the community.

To receive the service, please fill the ECAP application form. If you have a BC Hydro and a Fortis BC account, fill both sections of the application. Please drop the filled application at the reception in the band office or email/text it to Ehsan Haghi. We will collect the forms and submit them on your behalf.
