

Dear Pedestrians, Residents and Property Owners,

RE: Wallace Ditch Northern Repairs adjacent to 3899 West 51st Avenue

The City of Vancouver is starting construction to repair and prevent instability along the west slope of the Wallace Street Ditch, adjacent to 3899 West 51st Ave. Construction will involve vegetation removal, the installation of a culvert, and backfilling of the area.

The City of Vancouver construction crews will mobilize on June 21, 2021, to clear the area and ensure any deleterious material and standing water is removed prior to installing the culvert. Work is anticipated to be complete by July 09, 2021, weather permitting.

The City of Vancouver construction crews will make every effort to minimize the impact of their work concerning noise levels in your area. Work is anticipated to take between 7 am and 3:30 pm; Some of the noise you can expect to hear throughout the construction will be from the Hydro vac truck, backhoe, and excavator. The City of Vancouver construction crew will close the trail access between W 51st Ave and W 50th Ave (please refer to the attached picture) to maintain pedestrian safety during construction. Closure signage will be set up in place before any construction begins.

We have an emergency response and recovery plan that lays out the various actions that need to be taken to lessen the effects of an emergency event.

This Friday June 18th, we will be conducting a live training event that will help us test and evaluate the plan. More than 20 staff members will be involved in the training and you may expect to see them out in the community. They will be assessing a few community buildings and may post some signs on those buildings. If you see the teams standing outside buildings, taking notes, talking on 2-way radios, do not be alarmed. The team members are practicing their skills with the results being improved public safety.

PROCESS FOR MAINTENANCE CALLS

- 1) Head of household (name on Rental Agreement) are to call (604) 269-3381 or email brittanypoint@musqueam.bc.ca or servicerequest@musqueam.bc.ca to discuss the matter.
- 2) The service request is made and sent to Maintenance Mike Point and/or Tyson Nahanee
- 3) Before the visit please have the area clean, accessible, & sanitized.
- 4) Mike Point and/or Tyson Nahanee to go to the house then report back to Housing Admin.
- 5) *IF any parts or services are needed <u>Wait for Housing Managers</u> approval.
- 6) When approved:
 - a. Mike and/or Tyson to purchase/order parts.
 - b. If services are needed Housing Admin will have to contact vendors set up time and date.

Please understand that there is a time delay when it comes to purchasing/ordering part and when Housing Admin have to communicate with vendors.

- 7) * if necessary* Mike and/or Tyson to return to the home to do repairs/replacement after receiving the part needed or the technician will be at the house.
- 8) Service Request Complete.

Emergency service requests to call (604) 269 3381 immediately day or night. Emergencies include – Hot water tank not working, furnace not working, electrical problems or major leaks. Please provide correct contact information when making maintenance calls.

My name is Ehsan Haghi and I am the Community Energy Specialist at Musqueam Indian Band. I am going to share tips on how we can maintain our homes more effectively and reduce our hydro and gas bills.

Do your electric and electronic devices consume energy when they are off?

Also known as 'phantom power' or 'vampire power', it's the electricity that's being drawn even when your device is supposedly turned off. It's essentially wasted power than can add up to 10% of your electricity bill without you even realizing it.

What you can do to cut phantom power?

- Unplug little-used products Disconnect seldom used guest TVs and turn game consoles off when not in use. A set-top box and video game console left plugged in cost about \$36 a year.
- In the bathroom, unplug hair dryers, curling irons or electric shavers when not in use it is much safer and you will save energy.
- Unplug vacuums, power tools and other appliances from chargers once they have finished charging.
- Use a power bar with timer Plug electronic devices into a power bar with a timer to shut them off automatically.
- Disable computer screen savers Activate sleep mode on your computer instead of using a screen saver that uses twice as much energy.

Are you interested in receiving FREE energy saving products including LED lamps and water saving showerheads? Musqueam housing department is working with BC Hydro and Fortis BC to bring the Energy Conservation Assistance Program (ECAP) to the community. To receive the service, please fill the ECAP application form (next page). If you have a BC Hydro and a Fortis BC account, fill both sections of the application. Please drop the filled application at the reception in the band office or email/text it to Ehsan Haghi. We will collect the forms and submit them on your behalf.
