
Portrait of a Southlands Student

Important information if you want a Covid Vaccine-

- . All those who are born in 2009 and earlier are eligible for dose 1
- All members who have a minimum of 28 days between doses can get dose 2 (September 27th or earlier, you can get your 2nd dose at this years Flu Clinic)
- We do not have control over which Covid Vaccine we receive (Moderna or Pfizer)
- 3rd dose eligibility criteria is <u>very strict</u>, and BCCDC recommends ALL 3rd dose Covid vaccines will be the Moderna Vaccine regardless of which dose 1 and 2 you have had

Those with health conditions which make them severely immunocompromised (extremely weakened immune system) will receive a letter from their physician, stating they qualify to receive a 3rd dose of the Covid Vaccine. Contact your Primary Care Provider for further questions around the 3rd dose.

INDICATIONS:

· Individuals 12 years of age and older.

The vaccine is not approved for use in those less than 12 years of age.

DOSES AND SCHEDULE:

Individuals 12 years of age and older A: 2 doses given as 0.5 mL IM, 28 days apart. B, C, D, E

For individuals 12 years of age older who are severely immunosuppressed*, a 3-dose primary series is recommended ^F. Moderna COVID-19 vaccine is preferentially recommended for the 3rd dose, which should be provided at least 28 days after the 2nd dose. If Moderna is unavailable, Pfizer-BioNTech can be given.

- * Severely immunosuppressed includes individuals who:
 - Have had a solid organ transplant (heart, lung, liver, kidney, pancreas or islet cells, bowel or combination organ transplant).
 - Since January 2021, have been treated for and/or are receiving active treatment (chemotherapy, targeted therapies, immunotherapy) for malignant hematological disorders (e.g., leukemia, lymphoma, or myeloma).
 - Since January 2020, have received treatment with any anti-CD20 agents (i.e., rituximab, ocrelizumab, ofatumumab, obinutuzumab, ibritumomab, tositumomab).
 - Since January 2020, have been treated with B-cell depleting agents (i.e., epratuzumab, MEDI-551, belimumab, BR3-Fc, AMG-623, atacicept, anti-BR3, alemtuzumab).
 - Have combined immune deficiencies affecting T-cells, immune dysregulation or type 1 interferon defects.
 - Since September 2019, have had a bone marrow or stem cell transplant or are still taking immunosuppressant medications related to transplant.

SAFE DRINKING WATER MONITORING PROGRAM

December 2, 2020 — Ottawa, Traditional Algonquin Territory, Ontario — Indigenous Services Canada

As we work towards a more inclusive Canada, we must also make sure that basic needs are met. However, this is not always the case when it comes to the lived reality in Indigenous communities today. While most Canadians have access to clean and reliable drinking water, many First Nation communities still face pressing water issues; something that has been further exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Centuries of colonial policies and consistent underfunding of water-related services and systems has affected overall quality of life, widened socio-economic gaps and reduced First Nations' participation in the economy. Stronger and healthier communities, with better community infrastructure, leads to more prosperous communities.

Today, the Honourable Marc Miller, Minister of Indigenous Services, announced more than \$1.5 billion in additional investments to accelerate work to lift all long-term drinking water advisories on reserves, and \$114.1 million per year ongoing thereafter to support daily operations and maintenance for water infrastructure on reserves. This funding will support First Nations in their work to provide reliable and secure access to clean water in their communities. It will also offer stable and long-term funding for the cost of operations and maintenance; an area that has been under-funded for far too long, yet is critical to ensuring the lasting impacts of these investments. With this new funding, the Government of Canada is standing with First Nations partners to meet these basic needs and ensure access to clean and safe drinking water for generations to come.

Providing First Nations communities with the resources they need to operate and maintain their water systems is central to creating long-lasting solutions. To support daily operations and maintenance, and do so even after water advisories are lifted, we will allocate \$616.3 million over six years, and \$114.1 million per year ongoing thereafter, to First Nations on reserves. This new investment will provide reliable and lasting funding to ensure water infrastructure can be maintained in good condition — ensuring longer lifecycles and more durable systems. It will also mean problems with the water systems can be caught earlier and will help prevent future long-term drinking water advisories. This funding will also support training for water operators, and help communities to better retain qualified operators for years to come.

FORAGING AND DYEING WITH PLANTS AND MUSHROOMS: BLENDING TRADITIONAL COAST SALISH KNOWLEDGE WITH SCIENCE WITH RITA KOMPST AND ZOE MCDONNELL

This in-depth workshop will introduce workshop participants to the magic and wonder of natural dyeing using local sources. Workshop participants will learn the basics of foraging for dye materials as well as how to use these in practice to create beautiful colours. The workshop is a balance between traditional Coast Salish ecological knowledge and western science. Both perspectives provide students opportunities to deepen their connection with the natural world.



Each student will create a reference of dye samples to help guide further dyeing as well as their own sample skein to dye and take home.

Musqueam Fitness Area - Safety Reminders

We would like to remind everyone of the safety requirements for usage of the Fitness Area. We recognize the important of fitness for mental wellness and hope to continue to keep the fitness area open safely.

We also know as Musqueam community members we all have a duty to follow our values and during this pandemic this means showing respect to others, our facilities and ourselves. We can show this respect by following the safety measures that are in place to help prevent the spread of COVID-19.

These measures are in place for the sole reason of preventing the spread of COVID-19. They are guided by Provincial Health Orders that are created by the foremost experts on these types of pandemics and should not be taken lightly especially as we see the daily number of positive cases continue to rise in B.C.

Despite our best efforts we have noticed a large number of people NOT following these safety measures. We ask that you remind yourself of these safety measures and their importance.

Key Safety Protocols Reminders – Failure to follow these protocols will result in you being asked to leave the Fitness Area



- MASKS are mandatory and must be worn whenever you are in motion on the floor of the fitness area or in any other areas of the building.
- You cannot enter the building without a mask
- You must have your mask WITH YOU at all times
- You can take your mask off ONLY when you are on a cardio machine or in the motion of lifting a weight
- Ex. You must wear a mask when you are moving to a new machine, putting your weight away, going to the washroom, moving to another machine



Sanitize EVERYTHING you touch (weights, benches, mats, machines) This simple act can substantially prevent the spread of germs. Show respect to those using the equipment after you
