Dear Musqueam Community Members:

Moving forward through the latest developments of the Covid-19 Pandemic, we need to continue to limit or STOP movement between multiple families & other people's homes > to *protect our Elders* and *those with compromised immune systems*.

The **Stay in-Place** recommendation is meant to stop the spread of Covid-19 throughout the community by asking people to not interact socially with other households or families at this time. Individuals can still go to work, school or appointments if they are feeling well.

We are still seeing the number of positive cases rising day by day and we recommend continuing to practice limiting social interactions and not visiting homes of others. Anyone experiencing **any symptoms should isolate** and monitor those symptoms for 24 hours.

If the symptoms continue – please call the COVID hotline **236 688 4821** and request a rapid test from the health department. If you are positive, you will be required to submit an online survey – which will alert PHSA to call you!

- If you test positive > you will have to quarantine for **FIVE (5) days** if you have 2 vaccinations.
- If you do not have 2 vaccinations, you will have to quarantine for **10 days**.
- If you are still having symptoms cough, runny nose after your isolation period, you will need to isolate for an additional period of time.

We are extending our Stay-In Place recommendation.

This means

if you are Not Sick - you can still go to work, school, appointments, dining out, get gas, grocery shop, etc. What it does mean is that you should only visit or have interactions with your immediate family or household; and not visit multiple homes for social visits.

Be mindful of homes with *Elders or persons individuals with compromised immune systems* and do not visit for social reasons.

These recommendations are being extended to align with the Provincial Health restrictions currently in place until January 18th, 2022.





Be advised MIB Health is following the Updated BC Centre for Disease Control Guidelines with regard to Covid tests.

We are running low on all Covid Tests (nasal swab, gargle, and rapid tests) due to a recent surge in testing requests; more have been ordered but we are unsure of exact timeline on when we will receive more.

SYMPTOMS	WHAT TO DO	
 Fever (above 38° C) Loss of sense of smell or taste Chills Difficulty breathing 	1 or more of these symptoms: Get tested and stay home.	
 Sore throat Loss of appetite Headache Body aches Extreme fatigue or tiredness Nausea or vomiting Diarrhea 	If you have 1 symptom: Stay home until you feel better. 2 or more of these symptoms: Stay home and wait 24 hours to see if you feel better. Get tested if not better after 24 hours.	

WHAT NEXT AFTER YOU'VE DONE YOUR TEST?

If you receive a take home testing kit from MIB Health, it is helpful to us to self report to the CHN or Covid Liaison to help you navigate through next steps based off of your test result. If you or someone in your household tests positive, the Covid Liaison can assist with supports (like grocery orders) if needed.

- The Community Health Nurse is available to assist with questions, concerns around Covid testing, and/or results.
- The Covid Liaison is also available for additional information and/or supports during self-isolation.

SAFE DRINKING WATER MONITORING PROGRAM

FNHA Drinking Water Safety Program

Access to safe and reliable drinking water is essential to individual and population health. The Drinking Water Safety Program supports access to safe drinking water by working in partnership with First Nations communities.

Chief and Council are responsible for planning and development of capital facilities, which provide basic infrastructure needs such as drinking water. Community leadership is also responsible for day-to-day operation of water and wastewater systems, which includes sampling and testing of drinking water.

As part of the Drinking Water Safety Program team, FNHA Environmental Health Officers can:

- conduct drinking water system inspections and test drinking water for bacteriological, chemical, physical and radiological parameters to meet Guidelines for Canadian Drinking Water Quality Guidelines
- interpret drinking water quality results
- provide guidance and recommendations to communities about drinking water safety issues, such as Boil Water advisories, including Do Not Consume and Do Not Use advisories
- provide training for community-based water monitors to collect and send water samples for testing and, where available, analyze samples using in-community testing equipment
- review plans for new or upgraded community water systems
- provide information and support on safe drinking water practices and risk prevention to Chief and Council and community members
- investigate waterborne illnesses





Call for interest: Vancouver Public Library Board Trustee

The Vancouver Public Library (VPL) currently has an opening for a Board Trustee. This is a volunteer role. The VPL is on the unceded traditional territories of the Musqueam, Squamish, and Tsleil-Watuth Nations, and holds Reconciliation as a key institutional priority. We are seeking ways to respect and recognize the leadership of the local Nations, and would very much welcome inquiries from interested Nation members. I would be pleased to respond personally and provide any further details or information.

We will note that the current Library Act in BC requires that Library board trustees are residents or electors in Vancouver. This definition means that members of Musqueam, Squamish and Tsleil-Waututh Nations who are living in Vancouver are eligible, as well as members on Musqueam reserve lands, but members living outside of the City of Vancouver are not. The Library is currently exploring what legislative change will be needed in order to broaden eligibility to all members of the local Nations, as we see this as part of our responsibilities in implementing the rights of the local Nations under UNDRIP and the Library's commitments to Reconciliation.

In general, Library trustees are responsible for:

- Establishing the library's strategic direction and priorities
- Developing library policy
- Monitoring progress and spending against the library's budget
- Directing library system operations through the chief librarian

The role requires that a trustee participate in Library Board meetings eight times per year, as well as committee meetings, for a total of approx. 12 hours in each month with meetings. Transportation and childcare expenses related to trustee duties are reimbursed. Further Information for those interested in Library Board positions is available here: https://www.vpl.ca/about/board.
