COMMUNITY HEALTH COVID-19:

IF YOU NEED A COVID TEST PLEASE SEE THE FOLLOWING:

- **Covid test kits are available** Rapid antigen testing kits are free at pharmacies. Local pharmacies such as Southlands, Shoppers Drug Mart, & London Drugs.
- **There is NO need to test for clearance.** Some people can continue to test positive for months after contracting Covid-19, but are not contagious to others.
- **COVID-19 Vaccine's: Get your booster dose** | Rapid antigen testing kits are free at pharmacies. Current eligibility: Seniors and Indigenous people. Book an appointment for your second booster if you are: 70 years and older or 55 years and older and Indigenous. *Notify booking clerk you are Indigenous & over 55.

From the onset of pregnancy, until 3 months postpartum we offer weekly \$25.00 Save-on Foods Gift cards for nutritious foods such as – milk, eggs, cheese, fruits & vegetables to support healthy nutrition during pregnancy and breastfeeding.

- Nursing pads, as needed
- A one-time gift of an Electric Breast pump. **One** per family
- Welcome gift for your new baby

MUSQUEAM NATIONAL NATIVE ALCOHOL & DRUG ABUSE PROGRAM (NNADAP)

THE MUSQUEAM NNADAP TEAM AND MUSQUEAM PRIMARY CARE CLINIC MEDICATION SUPPORT FOR ADDICTION

The Musqueam Primary Care Clinic offers Musqueam community and band members addiction support through the issuance of prescribed medications. We offer support for opioid addiction (i.e. methadone, suboxone), and for alcohol addiction (i.e. naltrexone), and for overdose prevention (i.e. naloxone).

The NEC Native Education College is a private college for Indigenous learners to live their cultural heritage and realize their true potential. NEC works to strengthen Indigenous communities through accredited programs that lead to employment and higher learning. The Indigenous cultural values in NEC programs are at the core of reconciliation, economic success and a sustainable future for all nations. **NEC is currently seeking a Security Professional to uphold peace and create a safe atmosphere for students and staff.**

Position Summary:

The Security Professional will be a physical presence intended for upholding safety through customer service, observation, prevention and intervention. They will be available to respond to safety concerns brought forward by students or staff, monitor the premises for environmental or hazards caused by human actions, log pertinent and relevant information, and make interventions as required.

Main Responsibilities:

- Provide a welcoming and professional presence for staff, students and guests of NEC
- Identify and greet guests, using customer service to assist with wayfinding, and/or assess validity of visit. Escort guests to their destination.
- Respond to concerns, issues, or incidents involving the safety of staff or students on any of NEC's property
- Make ongoing rounds of NEC property, watching for, keeping a log of, and notifying Manager of any environmental or hazards caused by human actions.
- Maintain a log book, and process for communicating issues to management
- Prevent violence or harm against NEC students, staff or property
- Liaise with responders in the event of emergency
- Other cultural duties as required in the Longhouse

Qualifications:

Any combination of skills and experience may be considered:

- A valid Level 1 Security license
- 1 year experience in commercial or institutional security practice
- Valid First Aid Level 1 certificate (or willingness to obtain or re-certify)
- Trauma-informed, non-violent communication practice essential
- Experience working in Indigenous organizations (lived or professional)
- Strong awareness of inter-generational and ongoing trauma, and disparities of Indigenous Peoples in the criminal justice system.
- Awareness of own positional power and authoritative presence within context of Indigenous community.
- Indigenous applicant preferred

Appointment to this full-time Regular position will require a formal criminal record check, the details of which may preclude an offer of employment being finalized. NEC encourages members of equity-seeking groups to apply. Preference will be given to qualified Indigenous applicants.
