

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Musqueam UBC First Nations Scholarship

Musqueam First Nation students who are either newly admitted to or, currently registered at The University of British Columbia are invited to apply to the Musqueam First Nation Scholarship. This award was created to acknowledge the strong relationship between UBC and the Musqueam First Nation.

It is a community-based scholarship for students who are members of the Musqueam First Nation studying at the University of British Columbia in their undergraduate, post baccalaureate (including Medicine, Dentistry, Law, Education, Pharmacy, Nursing, Midwifery, and Social Work), and graduate studies. The award is valued up to \$5,500 annually and renewable for up to four (4) years.

Recipients will have demonstrated academic and leadership achievements including, but not limited to, engagement in the arts, athletics, school, and/or their community. Recipients will be selected on their ability to demonstrate their openness to continuing to learn who they are, where they come from, and their responsibility in enriching and carrying knowledge forward in their community and the world.

The application will be open from Friday, July 15, 2022 until- Wednesday, September 21, 2022 (11:59 PM PT). For more information about the award or to apply, please email musqueam.scholarship@ubc.ca

INDIGENOUS MD ADMISSIONS WORKSHOP JULY 27-29, 2022

The 19th annual Indigenous MD Admissions Workshop will take place at the Northern Medical Program, located on the University of Northern British Columbia campus in Prince George, BC.

EXPLORE A FUTURE IN MEDICINE

If you are thinking about pursuing a future in medicine, this is a unique opportunity to learn how UBC can support you in your studies and connect with an inclusive, caring community of medical practitioners, students, and faculty.

Our annual pre-admissions workshop for Indigenous pre-med students isn't just for those already in university. Prospective students, including postsecondary and high school students can explore what it means to attend university and embark on a journey to becoming a healthcare professional.

JOIN A CARING COMMUNITY

Being part of a community is important—it helps people feel connected to traditions and knowledge unique to them. At the UBC Faculty of Medicine, we are a community that celebrates our students' diverse perspectives on healthcare and Indigenous ways of knowing.

For nineteen years we've been providing the Indigenous MD Admissions Workshop dedicated to welcoming Indigenous people into our faculty and supporting them as they make a commitment to study medicine. We know that our annual workshop will give you an introduction to our community and help you feel more confident about your decision to study medicine.

WHY ATTEND?

To learn

- Find out about prerequisites, course planning, and get a preview of the medical curriculum and residency programs.
- Get an overview of the Medical College Admissions Test (MCAT), and learn about the UBC interview process by participating in mock interviews.
- Gain familiarity with the application process and admission requirements.

Meet faculty & staff

- Hear stories from doctors and faculty who chose UBC.
- Learn about student supports from a member of the Student Affairs team.
- Get the facts about your financial options from the Faculty of Medicine's Student Financial Assistance Officer.

Feel supported

- Learn about preparing your application from our MD Indigenous Initiatives Coordinator.
- Better understand specific Indigenous resources and support for students with Indigenous ancestry, including Status & non-Status Indians or Treaty, Métis & Inuit peoples.
- Hear from a local Elder during the opening and closing remarks.
- Ask questions of Indigenous medical students and residents to learn about their experiences.
- Find out more about what pursuing a career in medicine entails.



If you're feeling apprehensive about pursuing a medical degree, our workshop is one of the best ways to reduce your doubts, fears, or anxieties about pursuing your goal of becoming a medical doctor. You'll gain personal insights and guidance about your choice to study medicine with us.

We are excited about the remarkable students, alumni, and faculty who will be presenting and advising over all three days of the workshop and we hope you'll join us in July 2022.

WE'VE GOT YOU COVERED

There is *no cost* to attend the workshop.

Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, our workshop might look a little different than it has in the past, depending on public health guidelines. The decision to host the workshop in person or virtually will be announced in due time and successful applicants will be notified by email.

Should the workshop be hosted in person, the university will cover your accommodations and meals, however travel to/from the workshop will be your responsibility.

Along with your application, you'll need to prepare and submit:

- A 500-word autobiographical essay, including who you are and why you want to become a doctor.
- A copy of your most recent transcripts or report card.
- A copy of your proof of ancestry such as status, treaty and Métis membership cards. We also accept written letters of support from your Band, Inuit and Métis organizations.

COMMUNITY HEALTH COVID-19:

IF YOU NEED A COVID TEST PLEASE SEE THE FOLLOWING:

- Covid test kits are available Rapid antigen testing kits are free at pharmacies. Local pharmacies such as Southlands, Shoppers Drug Mart, & London Drugs.
- There is NO need to test for clearance. Some people can continue to test positive for months after contracting Covid-19, but are not contagious to others.
- COVID-19 Vaccine's: <u>Get your booster dose are free at your local pharmacy</u>. Current eligibility: Seniors and Indigenous people. Call your local pharmacy to Book an appointment for your COVID-19 Vaccine Booster eligibility is: if you are 70 years and older, or 55 years and older and Indigenous. *Notify booking clerk you are Indigenous & over 55.

Rapid antigen testing kits are free for residents of B.C. 18 years and older who have a Personal Health Number (PHN).

1 kit contains 5 individual tests. You are allowed 1 kit every 28 days. This makes sure that everyone who wants a kit can get one. You can't pay for additional kits.

A test should only be used by people who develop symptoms of COVID-19 and want to confirm a positive or negative result. <u>The tests are not suitable for international travel requirements.</u>

Pharmacy staff will:

• Ask for your PHN. You can find your PHN on the back of your B.C. driver's license, BC Services Card or Care Card

A pharmacy should never ask you to pay for a kit. Members residing off reserve may now pick up a test kit at their local pharmacy.

You can pick up a kit for someone else, like a parent or grandparent. Make sure you know their full name, date of birth and PHN, the pharmacist will ask you for that information.

Travel: if you choose to travel and are required to self-isolate by the Canadian Border Services, this is your responsibility and Musqueam Health Department does not provide supports, please make prior arrangements with your family and friends.

News updates from the First Nations Health Authority

Common allergy symptoms include sneezing, runny or stuffy nose, itchy or watery eyes, itchy nose or ears, post-nasal drip (which can sometimes cause a mild sore throat), and mild fatigue (not including drowsy-causing allergy medications).

SAFE DRINKING WATER MONITORING PROGRAM

Safe Drinking Water from the tap:

All UBC Food Services locations, including the Residence Dining Rooms, offer free tap water. When you are out and about, Metro Vancouver's TapMap is a great way to find free places to refill water bottles. When you consider that bottled water and other beverages are a 100% markup on free tap water, the math is simple: After the initial investment in a water bottle, tap water will save you money! Reduce Waste

Bottled water vs. tap water...what's better? Water is universally better for you than sugar-sweetened beverages, but often bottled water is simply re-packaged municipal tap water. Opting for tap water over bottled water not only reduces waste from single-use containers and requires less energy to transport, but in Metro Vancouver tap water is held to much higher safety standards than bottled water. Plus, even recyclable bottles require energy and resources, and millions of single-use water bottles still end up in our landfills. SEEDS investigated the sustainability of bottled water vs. tap water a few years ago.
