

Musqueam Indian Band is looking for a Facilities Assistant!

This is a full-time permanent position, working 35 hours a week with some evenings and weekends. The wage rate is around \$20/hourly.

The Facilities Assistant works as a front-line representative on behalf of Musqueam facilities. Job duties involves things like working with customers, scheduling and coordinating events, working with vendors, and assisting with setting up and cleaning the facilities. Position Title: Assistant Archivist Department: Archives and Research Dept. Wage: \$29.50 per hour (\$53,690 per annum)

Position Summary:

Working within the Archives and Research Department and Reporting to the Senior Archivist, the Assistant Archivist will be responsible for assisting on special projects and regular archival tasks (digitization, arrangement and description, accessions, inventories, etc.) in order to gain experience in all aspects of archival work. The assistant archivist will have the opportunity to learn about all aspects of the archives and projects through our internal meetings, and by attending external meetings, this includes collaborative projects with the various arms of the Archives and Research Dept. The assistant archivist will be required to be flexible in changing their task or project to suit an ever-changing environment of priorities, and to learn and adopt the meaning of "musqueamizing" archival practice into their work. The archives assistant may from time to time be asked to work on projects supervised by the records manager.

Collections Processing and Access:

- Help determine arrangement and description plans for incoming donations.
- Adding descriptions and metadata to our archival database of the already accessioned collections
- Digitization and transcription of A/V records
- Transcription of textual records

Reference and Research

- Support the department Manager and Senior Archivist in research requests from both internal and external sources.
- Conduct research to identify collections of materials at external institutions of value for Musqueam and acquire copies. This may require a willingness to travel.

Job Knowledge:

- Post-secondary degree. Some graduate coursework in museum studies, archival studies, history, anthropology, English, linguistics, or education, an asset, or an equivalent combination of life/school/work experience.

- Willingness to engage with and learn həndəminəm and to differentiate the həndəminəm language and Musqueam cultural practices from other communities, or an ability to learn, is required



COMMUNITY HEALTH COVID-19:

IF YOU NEED A COVID TEST PLEASE SEE THE FOLLOWING:

- Covid test kits are available Rapid antigen testing kits are free at pharmacies. Local pharmacies such as Southlands, Shoppers Drug Mart, & London Drugs.
- There is NO need to test for clearance. Some people can continue to test positive for months after contracting Covid-19, but are not contagious to others.
- COVID-19 Vaccine's: <u>Get your booster dose</u>
 <u>- free at your local pharmacy</u>.
- Current eligibility: Seniors and Indigenous people. Call your local pharmacy to Book an appointment for your COVID-19 Vaccine Booster eligibility is: if you are 70 years and older, or 55 years and older and Indigenous. *Notify booking clerk you are Indigenous & over 55.

Rapid antigen testing kits are free for residents of B.C. 18 years and older who have a Personal Health Number (PHN).

1 kit contains 5 individual tests. You are allowed 1 kit every 28 days. This makes sure that everyone who wants a kit can get one. You can't pay for additional kits.

A test should only be used by people who develop symptoms of COVID-19 and want to confirm a positive or negative result. <u>The tests are not suitable for</u> <u>international travel requirements.</u>

Pharmacy staff will:

 Ask for your PHN. You can find your PHN on the back of your B.C. driver's license, BC Services Card or Care Card

A pharmacy should never ask you to pay for a kit. Members residing off reserve may now pick up a test kit at their local pharmacy.

You can pick up a kit for someone else, like a parent or grandparent. Make sure you know their full name, date of birth and PHN, the pharmacist will ask you for that information.

Travel: if you choose to travel and are required to selfisolate by the Canadian Border Services, this is your responsibility and Musqueam Health Department does not provide supports, please make prior arrangements with your family and friends.

News updates from the First Nations Health Authority

Common allergy symptoms include sneezing, runny or stuffy nose, itchy or watery eyes, itchy nose or ears, post-nasal drip (which can sometimes cause a mild sore throat), and mild fatigue (not including drowsy-causing allergy medications).

ALL ABOARD THE HandyDART!



What is HandyDART?

- > It is a door-to-door, shared ride service for people who have trouble navigating public transit.
- HandyDART is a convenient option for medical appointments you don't have to worry about finding or paying for parking!

Who is eligible?

- If you have a physical, sensory, or cognitive disability you may be eligible to use HandyDART. Ask your care provider if you are eligible.
- You must register with TransLink by submitting an application form that has been signed by a health professional.

How does it work?

- > The buses run seven days a week, but rides must be booked in advance.
- > All trips are paid with either exact change \$2.05 \$3.10 or by using a Compass ticket.

The Musqueam Primary Care Clinic offers Musqueam community and band members addiction support through the issuance of prescribed medications. We offer support for opioid addiction (i.e. methadone, suboxone), and for alcohol addiction (i.e. naltrexone), and for overdose prevention (i.e. naloxone).




