- There may be two booster vaccine products available this fall, the new bivalent booster (Wuhan and Omicron) and the current monovalent booster (Wuhan strain). Both Booster vaccines are excellent. Eligibility criteria for the Fall Booster will be announced closer to the start of the campaign. Federal approval for the new bivalent booster vaccine is expected mid-September, but this is not guaranteed.
- Anyone 18 years of age and older may receive a second booster dose now should they wish to, but it is preferable to delay their second booster dose until the fall.

### COMMUNITY HEALTH COVID-19:

**Rapid antigen testing kits** are free for residents of B.C. 18 years and older who have a Personal Health Number (PHN).

1 kit contains 5 individual tests. You are allowed 1 kit every 28 days. This makes sure that everyone who wants a kit can get one. You can't pay for additional kits.

A test should only be used by people who develop symptoms of COVID-19 and want to confirm a positive or negative result. The tests are not suitable for international travel requirements.


### Pharmacy staff will:

 Ask for your PHN. You can find your PHN on the back of your B.C. driver's license, BC Services Card or Care Card

A pharmacy should never ask you to pay for a kit. Members residing off reserve may now pick up a test kit at their local pharmacy.

You can pick up a kit for someone else, like a parent or grandparent. Make sure you know their full name, date of birth and PHN, the pharmacist will ask you for that information.

**Travel:** if you choose to travel and are required to selfisolate by the Canadian Border Services, this is your responsibility and Musqueam Health Department does not provide supports, please make prior arrangements with your family and friends.

# **ALL ABOARD THE HandyDART!**



### What is HandyDART?

- > It is a door-to-door, shared ride service for people who have trouble navigating public transit.
- HandyDART is a convenient option for medical appointments you don't have to worry about finding or paying for parking!

### Who is eligible?

- If you have a physical, sensory, or cognitive disability you may be eligible to use HandyDART. Ask your care provider if you are eligible.
- You must register with TransLink by submitting an application form that has been signed by a health professional.

#### How does it work?

- The buses run seven days a week, but rides must be booked in advance.
- > All trips are paid with either exact change \$2.05 \$3.10 or by using a Compass ticket.

### Indigenous Education Specialist (3-month term position)

Nestled in the heart of downtown Vancouver, the Bill Reid Gallery is Canada's only public gallery dedicated to contemporary Indigenous Art of the Northwest Coast. The Gallery celebrates the vital and diverse Indigenous cultures of the Northwest Coast through the extraordinary work of Bill Reid and the presentation of exceptional contemporary art.

We respectfully acknowledge the x<sup>w</sup>məθkwəỳəm (Musqueam), Skwxwú7mesh (Squamish), and səlilwətał (Tsleil-Waututh), and all the Indigenous peoples of the Northwest Coast, on whose traditional and unceded territories we live and work.

### Job description

The Gallery is seeking a creative, enthusiastic, and motivated Indigenous Education Specialist. Reporting to the Curator, the Education Specialist will promote, deliver and evaluate education programs for grades K-12, as well as professional development programs for educators.

The ideal candidate will have 2-5 years of experience in youth and community centered education and programming, preferably in an arts or Indigenous organization. You have a proven track record of working with Indigenous communities and creating and implementing youth driven programming and educational experiences.

### Specific duties include:

- Using creative and innovative thinking in a non-traditional teaching and learning environment
- Conducting education tours, programs, workshops, and other presentations that align with BC curriculum, including hands-on activities
- Liaising with teachers to schedule class tours and professional development programs
- Distributing materials to promote educational programs to schools and community in collaboration with marketing staff
- Communicating information, through presentations and events, about the Gallery's education programs to schools, community groups and potential partners.

#### Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:

- Ability to communicate and interact positively with students and teachers
- Knowledge of BC curriculum and core competencies
- Knowledge of Northwest Coast art and Indigenous cultural history
- Fluent in English, Indigenous language would be an asset
- Excellent oral communication and interpersonal skills
- Friendly, outgoing personality; excited to meet, engage, and facilitate
- Experience working in teams and an interest in building leadership skills
- Possess excellent time management, organization, and multi-tasking skills
- Previous experience and/or interest in working with children and/or youth
- Self-motivated, energetic, forward-thinking, and creative with strong attention to detail
- Ability to monitor budgets

#### Qualifications:

- Post-Secondary degree in a related field (Education, Indigenous Studies, etc.), and/or equivalent community-based experience.
- First Aid and CPR certificate is an asset
- A criminal record check will be required
- Indigenous peoples are strongly encouraged to apply. Preference for this role will support
  individuals who have lived experience as Indigenous and have existing relations with Indigenous
  communities.
- Candidates will be chosen on the basis of their skill level and ability; therefore we welcome all
  applicants regardless of race, gender or disability

This is a three-month term position, with possibility of renewal. The Indigenous Education Specialist will work 4 days per week, mostly 9:30 am – 5:30 pm with flexibility for Gallery events and programs on evenings and weekends as required. The work is primarily onsite in an office environment and in the Gallery. Monthly salary is \$3,000 based on experience and qualifications. The Bill Reid Gallery actively supports a healthy workplace, and offers flexible schedules, statutory holiday substitutions, and other health and cultural safety measures.


