
If your child(ren) is planning on riding the school bus this year, please fill out and return the MIB School Bus Form on the following page.

It is strongly recommended that parents/caregivers wait with their young children at the bus stop until they are on the bus.



More Information

Clinic staff are trained in the delivery of childhood COVID-19 immunizations, and are committed to making it a positive experience for families. Musqueam will establish a separate quiet space for children with special needs such as autism, sensory processing, or needle phobia. Older children from five years of age and above continue to be eligible for vaccination. Parents or guardians with several children will be accommodated for immunizations.

Safety of vaccines for use in children

Although children are less likely to get severe COVID-19 infections, they can still get sick from the virus and have long-term consequences. They may also spread the infection to others.


Regardless of your child's age, it is important to keep their routine immunizations other vaccine-preventable diseases up-to-date. A strong immune system can reduce the impact of COVID-19, and prevent illness from other communicable diseases. To receive the best protection, children should receive two doses with at least eight weeks between the first and second dose.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT COVID-19 BIVALENT VACCINES

Now that <u>Health Canada has approved use of the bivalent COVID-19 vaccine</u>, **BC is preparing to deploy them to clinics in time for the fall booster campaign.**

Many people who have had their first booster will by now be eligible for their next booster in order to maintain high levels of immunity against COVID-19 and its variant forms throughout the colder months when respiratory viruses more commonly spread. (from their last booster 6 months prior)

Pharmacies and clinics are expected to have a supply of the bivalent vaccine by mid-to-late September.

Have questions about the bivalent vaccines or curious about what the term "bivalent" even means? Here are some answers to common questions about this new vaccine!

What is a bivalent vaccine?

The new vaccine developed by Moderna and approved by Health Canada—following a thorough and independent scientific review—targets not just the original COVID-19 virus, but also the Omicron variant that is found to spread more easily.

Clinical trial tests showed that this bivalent vaccine triggers a strong immune response against both the original virus strain and also Omicron subvariants.

It is important to note that all current vaccines are very effective at triggering a strong immune response against COVID-19 and all known variants, and that you do not need a bivalent vaccine to be protected against COVID-19.

Who can receive a bivalent vaccine? When can I get one?

Everyone who is 18 years of age and older can receive the bivalent vaccine, as well as those 12 to 17 who are at increased risk with specific medical conditions.

To be eligible to receive a booster you should have received your last dose more than six months ago and have not had a COVID-19 infection in the past three months.

Canada will receive 12 million doses of bivalent vaccine from Moderna, with provinces expected to receive shipments over the next few days in order to run clinics in September and throughout October.

We expect to have sufficient supply of the bivalent vaccine for all who wish to receive it this fall.

I don't want a bivalent vaccine or a mRNA vaccine but I want to be protected against COVID-19. What are my options?

The bivalent uses mRNA technology—the same vaccine delivery method used safely in hundreds of millions of vaccinations worldwide.

COMMUNITY HEALTH COVID-19:

Rapid antigen testing kits are free for residents of B.C. 18 years and older who have a Personal Health Number (PHN).

1 kit contains 5 individual tests. You are allowed 1 kit every 28 days. This makes sure that everyone who wants a kit can get one. You can't pay for additional kits.

A test should only be used by people who develop symptoms of COVID-19 and want to confirm a positive or negative result. The tests are not suitable for international travel requirements.

Pharmacy staff will:

 Ask for your PHN. You can find your PHN on the back of your B.C. driver's license, BC Services Card or Care Card

A pharmacy should never ask you to pay for a kit. Members residing off reserve may now pick up a test kit at their local pharmacy.

You can pick up a kit for someone else, like a parent or grandparent. Make sure you know their full name, date of birth and PHN, the pharmacist will ask you for that information.

Travel: if you choose to travel and are required to selfisolate by the Canadian Border Services, this is your responsibility and Musqueam Health Department does not provide supports, please make prior arrangements with your family and friends.
