Upcoming Work

The <u>Iona Island Wastewater Treatment Plant</u> (IIWWTP) in the City of Richmond, is being upgraded to protect public health and the environment in a growing region. Metro Vancouver is planning to conduct in-water geotechnical investigations to support the design of the new plant and seismic resilience for the project.

Overnight Work

Starting on November 22, 2022 for approximately two weeks, Metro Vancouver will conduct in-water geotechnical drilling work in the North Arm of the Fraser River and in McDonald Slough (see map on reverse). This geotechnical drilling work will begin in the North Arm of the Fraser River and will switch back and forth between locations in McDonald Slough. The North Arm work is expected to be completed over a 9-day period while the McDonald Slough work will take approximately six days. This work will occur 24 hours a day and seven days a week. All work will comply with City of Richmond bylaws or granted bylaw variances.

Eight geotechnical investigation locations in the North Arm Fraser River will be positioned outside of the navigation channel. These investigation locations are bordered by the City of Vancouver and Musqueam Indian Reserve 2 to the north, and the City of Richmond to the south. Three additional geotechnical investigation sites will be located in McDonald Slough. The timing for the inwater investigations takes into consideration the surrounding environmental constraints and marine user groups and works will be undertaken outside of the fisheries window (reduced periods of risk to fish and fish habitats).

Noise Impacts

At times during this work, residents and businesses may hear noise from the use of equipment needed to complete the work. Sources of potential noise from investigation activities include:

- Sonic vibrations during drilling
- Vessel engine noise
- Intermittent hammer strikes at three investigation locations

Metro Vancouver is committed to minimizing impacts on the community, and will ensure that measures are in place to reduce noise, including:

- Adding sound baffling measures to buffer noise impacts
- Timing the work so that most of the noise generating activities occur in the day

Project Operations and Lighting

A barge (approximately 25 metres long) will be maneuvered by tugboat and positioned at each geotechnical investigation locations, and additional support vessels will be used to transport equipment and personnel to and from the barge.

The barge will be equipped with portable lighting towers to illuminate the workspace on the barge and navigational lighting will be used by the tug and support vessels. Lighting will be positioned in an upstream direction to identify any floating debris coming down river.

Community Liaison

Metro Vancouver is committed to minimizing the impacts of this work on residents and the community. A Community Liaison has been assigned to this project who will be available to discuss the project impacts and address any questions or concerns.

SAFE DRINKING WATER MONITORING PROGRAM

Safe Drinking Water Monitoring by Charlene Campbell-Wood

If you are experiencing an odd taste, odour or colour of your tap water in your home, please email or call the Musqueam Health Department at 604-263-3261 and they will inform me and I'll place a call to our Environmental Health Officer She usually may accompany me. I will then be able to test your water as soon as possible. In the meantime, drink bottled water.



COMMUNITY HEALTH COVID-19:

Rapid antigen testing kits are free for residents of B.C. 18 years and older who have a Personal Health Number (PHN).

1 kit contains 5 individual tests. You are allowed 1 kit every 28 days.

A test should only be used by people who develop symptoms of COVID-19 and want to confirm a positive or negative result. The tests are not suitable for international travel requirements.

Pharmacy staff will:

Ask for your PHN. You can find your PHN on the back of your B.C. driver's license, BC Services Card or Care Card

A pharmacy should never ask you to pay for a kit. Members residing off reserve may now pick up a test kit at their local pharmacy.

You can pick up a kit for someone else, like a parent or grandparent. Make sure you know their full name, date of birth and PHN, the pharmacist will ask you for that information.

Travel: if you choose to travel and are required to selfisolate by the Canadian Border Services, this is your responsibility and Musqueam Health Department does not provide supports, please make prior arrangements with your family and friends.

LifeGuard App & How it works

When someone is about to use, especially alone, they can open the app and record the type of substance they are using and confirm their location. The app will hold this information, and a timer is set which can be paused or extended by the app user at any time.

As the timer ends, the app will sound an alarm, flash a light, and vibrate. The user must hit a button to stop the alarm and indicate they are fine. If they are unable to stop the alarm, a text-to-voice call will go straight to 9-1-1. This alerts emergency medical dispatchers
