



LifeGuard App & How it works

When someone is about to use, especially alone, they can open the app and record the type of substance they are using and confirm their location. The app will hold this information, and a timer is set which can be paused or extended by the app user at any time.

As the timer ends, the app will sound an alarm, flash a light, and vibrate. The user must hit a button to stop the alarm and indicate they are fine. If they are unable to stop the alarm, a text-to-voice call will go straight to 9-1-1. This alerts emergency medical dispatchers



BC CANCER BREAST SCREENING REGIS

BC Cancer Breast Screening provides screening mammograms to **eligible BC residents age 40 and over**. If under 40, a doctor's referral is required.

MANDATORY ELIGIBILITY QUESTIONS:

Are you currently pregnant?

Have you been breast feeding in the last three months?

Have you had breast enlargement surgery, such as implants or injections?

Have you had breast cancer?

Do you now have any new breast complaints such as a solitary lump or nipple discharge?

Have you had a mammogram on both breasts in the last 12 months?

If the answer is <u>YES</u> to any of the questions above you would not be eligible for screening mammography at this time. Please contact your primary care provides (family doctor, clinic, nurse practitioner or naturopath) to find out about other breast exam options.

2023 spring biofilm and western sandpiper field work

Field work employment opportunities

The Vancouver Fraser Port Authority is committed to Indigenous participation in field studies as part of the ongoing environmental and technical work for the proposed Roberts Bank Terminal 2 (RBT2) project. This spring, the port authority plans to continue technical studies on biofilm and western sandpipers in the Fraser River estuary. To support the collection of data, the port authority is seeking Indigenous participants to be a part of the field team.

Role description

Applicants may express interest in one or more of the following roles, as there may be one or more studies operating at the same time:

- Assist in salinity data downloads and the collection of biofilm and sediment samples at predefined locations
 on the intertidal mudflats of Roberts Bank and Westham Island
- Assist in the counting and collection of western sandpiper fecal deposits ('droppings') on the intertidal mudflats of Roberts Bank, Westham Island, and Boundary Bay
- · Assist in the processing and storage of samples
- Accompany a drone operator in the collection of aerial imagery
- Work in accordance with established health and safety protocols

Time commitments

- Approximately 2 to 3 hours of training and health and safety review before field work commencement
- Approximately 2 to 4 days per week in the field between late March and late May 2023, including weekends. See below for approximate field work schedule.
- Approximately 6 to 10 hours in the field per field day, dependent on the tasks and tides
- Up to 370 technician field hours available over the duration of 37 field days (subject to change)

Skills desired

- A high degree of physical fitness as the work is very physically demanding. The work will involve moving through muddy terrain for an extended period (6 to 10 hours per field day)
- Experience performing environmental sampling work in adverse field conditions
- Knowledge of Roberts Bank marine ecology
- Team player with a positive attitude who does not mind getting muddy

On-the-job training can be provided if candidates do not possess all the desired skills/knowledge

Training required

In preparation for the field work, the team member will be required to undertake a paid 2-to-3-hour training session to discuss survey methods, and to review healthy and safety protocols.

Equipment required

The employee will be required to wear tight-fitting rubber boots or hip waders (provided by the port authority) to access the mudflats.

Supports individuals and families in connecting with Elders onsite. Supports Elders in cultural activities. Helps Elder in scheduling appointments and charting visits in the Medical record system.

Direct Patient Interaction:

- Greeting and registering arriving patients in a prompt, warm, and helpful manner and answering patients' questions;
- Develop and maintain healthy relationships with patients/ community members;
- Assisting with booking, coordinating, and rescheduling appointments for Elders:
- Maintaining and updating information and messaging medical team members as needed;
- Maintaining the reception area and overseeing the general waiting area and coordinating patient flow;
- Answering incoming calls, taking and relaying messages, communicating cultural & wellness activity information,
- Utilizing cultural training to have an understanding of Indigenous experience accessing healthcare; and
- Interacting with patients in a professional and courteous manner, displaying a high level of professionalism and appropriate discretion pertaining to patient privacy.

Coordination:

- Answer calls, return same day voicemail messages, respond to booking emails;
- Reach out to individuals for appointment reminders:
- Assist in obtaining the necessary supplies required for cultural activities;
- Assist in planning and coordinating cultural activities and ceremonies;

- Help individuals prepare to meet with an Elder with conversation and sharing basic protocols when we meet with Elders;

Mental Health Team Lead Role

The Mental Health (MH) Team Lead offers mental health triage for patients who are attached to Lu'ma Medical Centre for primary care service, meeting people where they are at, assessing needs together, connecting people with the right supports in a respectful, responsive and timely way. The MH Team Lead works side by side with, supports, and leads the activities of the Counselling team of 3 and BSW Social Navigation team of 2, including chairing team meetings, one-on-one clinical supervision as needed, caseload & charting support, and upholding best standards of practice.

Clinical Assessment:

- Clinical program coordination, new client assessment, safety planning, referral; and
- Provide Mental health triage, crisis Counselling when a Patient is in need, and charting visits.

Support Work


