

Background:

There is a vibrant and growing Indigenous student community at The University of British Columbia's two campuses, with the Vancouver campus located on the traditional, ancestral, and unceded territory of the Musqueam people, and the Okanagan campus located on the traditional, ancestral, and unceded territory of the Syilx Okanagan Nation.

As UBC's prospective undergraduate student recruitment marketing team, we produce a number of items to support UBC's Indigenous student recruitment team in their work to engage, attract, and welcome Indigenous students to UBC.

We have partnered with <u>pipikwan pêhtâkwan</u> to develop a sub-brand to support our Indigenous recruitment efforts. The sub-brand will help connect the main University of British Columbia institutional brand with our Indigenous audience.

The opportunity:

We are seeking artists from the Musqueam Indian Band and Syilx Okanagan Nation to develop the brand themes identified by pipikwan pêhtâkwan into logos and graphic elements that can be used on the communication materials used for prospective Indigenous student recruitment.

Interested artists are invited to review the 2022 Indigenous Handbook for examples of our previous work. <u>Digital copies are available online here</u>, and physical copies can be requested by emailing <u>amy.gibson@ubc.ca</u>.

Scope of work and deliverables:

The selected artist(s) will work with the design team at pipikwan pêhtâkwan to develop creative assets that make up the new sub-brand. The work and deliverables outlined as part of this project that the selected artist(s) will work on include:

- Collaborating with pipikwan pêhtâkwan on concepts and direction.
- Designing a logo and graphic elements inspired by the concepts and themes identified by pipikwan pêhtâkwan (see attached sketches and colour palette).
- Supplying final deliverables, including digital illustrations that align with the visual direction.

The design will need to work alongside the existing UBC brand and represent our two host nations, the Musqueam Indian Band and the Syilx Okanagan Nation.

UBC will retain exclusive use rights for this artwork to be used indefinitely as part of our recruitment of prospective Indigenous students. The artist(s) can showcase this work on their personal website or in their portfolio, but it cannot be used for commercial purposes.

Remuneration:

The production team has allocated a budget of up to \$6,500 for the artist(s) selected for this project.

How to apply:

Artists from the Musqueam Indian Band and the Syilx Okanagan Nation wishing to learn more about this opportunity are invited to supply an expression of interest as follows:

While a portfolio is requested with your submission, Musqueam and Syilx students and alumni of UBC looking to establish themselves as artists or illustrators are encouraged to apply.

Timelines:

- Expressions of interest are requested by April 14, 2023
 - o All artists will be contacted by April 21, 2023, with the successful candidates being briefed on the project the week of April 24.
 - o First draft/sketches are requested by May 15, 2023, with feedback from UBC due by May 19, 2023.
 - Revisions are requested by June 9, 2023, with feedback from UBC due by June 15, 2023.
 - o Additional revisions may be required depending on the scope of the feedback, with final artwork required for early July 2023.

Job title: Summer Collections Technician

Funding dependent, the Museum of Vancouver is seeking a Summer Collections Technician to assist with the cataloguing and digitization of new acquisitions, and to aid the Conservator with data entry related to scientific analyses of objects in the collection.

The Museum of Vancouver invites applications for the temporary position of Summer Collections Technician. This full-time position is funded in part by the Young Canada Works employment initiative, a joint venture of the Department of Canadian Heritage and the Parks Canada Agency. The successful candidate will be primarily responsible for cataloging, numbering, digitizing and storing new acquisitions. The position will also include interpreting and transcribing conservation scientific reports to the database The successful candidate will work closely with the Curator of Collections, Curatorial Associate, and Conservator, and participate in Collections Committee, Curatorial, and all-staff meetings.

The ideal candidate will have at least two years of post-secondary education in a related field (museum studies, library and archives, archaeology, history). Previous experience in a museum or archives environment involving object handling, conservation science and databases is an asset. The candidate must possess superior written and oral communication skills in English, be detail oriented, manually dexterous, possess an eye for the aesthetically pleasing, be comfortable in a fast-paced, multi-faceted organization, and have enthusiasm for both museums and collections.

Eligible candidates must:

- be a Canadian citizen or a permanent resident, or have refugee status in Canada; Note: Non-Canadian students holding temporary work visas or awaiting permanent status are not eligible.
- be legally entitled to work in Canada;
- be between 16 and 30 years of age at the start of employment;
- be willing to commit to a work assignment lasting for 15 weeks;
- not have another full-time job (over 30 hours a week) while employed with YCW;
- have been a full-time student (as defined by your educational institution) in the semester preceding the YCW job;
- intend to return to full-time studies in the semester following the YCW job.

Note: Students with a disability are eligible for part-time work

The Museum of Vancouver strives for equity and diversity. We encourage applications from members of groups that have been marginalized on any grounds enumerated under the B.C. Human Rights Code, including sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, racialization, disability, and identification as an Indigenous person.







How should a water cooler be cleaned?


- 1. Reservoir: (Note: <u>Clean your bottled water cooler before every bottle change.</u>)
- 2. **Drip Tray** (located under faucets)
- **3. Replacing Bottle:** (Some companies suggest using one part vinegar to three parts water solution to clean the reservoir of scale before cleaning with bleach. <u>Check your water cooler manual.</u>)

If you are experiencing an odd taste, odour or colour from your tap water in your home, please email or call the Musqueam Health Department at 604-263-3261 and they will inform me and I'll place a call to our Environmental Health Officer. The Environmental Health Officer may accompany me. I will then be able to test your water as soon as possible. In the meantime, drink bottled water.

LifeGuard App & How it works

When someone is about to use, especially alone, they can open the app and record the type of substance they are using and confirm their location. The app will hold this information, and a timer is set which can be paused or extended by the app user at any time.

As the timer ends, the app will sound an alarm, flash a light, and vibrate. The user must hit a button to stop the alarm and indicate they are fine. If they are unable to stop the alarm, a text-to-voice call will go straight to 9-1-1. This alerts emergency medical dispatchers
