

JOB DESCRIPTION

Duties:

As per IBEW Collective Agreement.

An Interchange Plant Operator (IPO) is a qualified electrical worker responsible for the remote operation of small hydro-electric plants as assigned by Operating Orders. In addition, the role is responsible for implementation of the Open Access Transmission Tariff in real-time including the determination of Net Interchange Schedules with adjacent Balancing Authorities including curtailing said schedules on direction from the System Operator.

The successful candidate will:

- * Learn the switching and operation of power system equipment in generating stations and electrical substations
- * Learn about the control of water flows at generating stations for power production, recreation and fisheries needs
- * Learn the computer system tools and processes for facilitating the transmission and power market
- * Work rotating shifts -- in a 365 days/year operation while calmly and confidently handling emergencies as they occur

Qualifications:

- * High school graduation with Physics 11, Math 11 and English 12, or equivalent courses taken at College or University level.
- * Where equivalent or higher status is claimed, documentation from the educational institution or the Ministry of Education must be provided by the applicant that will show equivalency or a higher level of the required Math, English and Physics courses taken
- * Successful completion of related post-secondary courses will be considered an asset

- * Must be in good health with normal colour vision
- * Electrical / mechanical aptitude and an analytical approach to problem solving are essential
- * Must have the ability to work shift work
- * Valid class 5 BC driver's license or higher, or equivalent from other provinces

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

This position is affiliated with the international Brotherhood of Electrical Workers Union (IBEW local 258) www.ibew258.bc.ca

THE PROGRAM

- * The Apprentice IPO will undergo a 12 month competency based training program to develop their skillset towards becoming a qualified IPO journey person.
- * The training is comprised of Self Study modules targeted at the essential knowledge components of the position. On the Job (OTJ) task lists to focus on the essential skills of the position. Field trip assignments including 5 days of dedicated training at a major hydro-electric facility and 2 days of dedicated training at small hydro-electric facilities focusing on water conveyance.
- * The A&TTC will provide oversight in accordance with Appendix "B".
- * Upon completion of the training program and authorization testing, the Apprentice IPO will receive an IPO graduation certificate
- * Selected applicants to the program must commit to a minimum of two (2) years' time in role in the IPO classification. The time-in-role requirement does not include time spent in training.
- * Upon graduation, the trainee will become an IPO with the associated hourly wage rate.

THE LOCATION

Apprentice IPO's work at the control center in Langley, BC with the exception of field site visits as required by the program.

THE FUTURE

You will work at the control centre in Langley. Opportunities for advancement exist as you gain experience, demonstrate your expertise, and show a willingness to learn. We are also building capacity at our Vernon office (SIO) and this may be a future location opportunity. The target start date for the program is September 2023.

THE BENEFITS

Besides having a challenging and satisfying career, you're paid while you learn and have an excellent benefit package. Apprentices earn 63.6% of the full trade rate, with the starting apprentice rate at \$37.25. The journey person rate is \$49.67.

THE DEMANDS

Because Interchange Plant Operators communicate with field personnel by telephone or radio, sometimes under very stressful or emergency conditions, spoken English must be excellent. Confidence in providing clear directions to others and the ability to deal with competing demands is strongly desired. Applicants should be able to work 24/7 shifts, handle detail and stress well, and be able to plan tasks and communicate clearly in critical situations.

- * BC Hydro conducts pre-placement medical checks of applicants entering certain positions to help safeguard BC Hydro's workplace. As part of the selection process, you may be required to demonstrate successful completion of a pre-placement medical check.

Our four role types identify the degree of flexibility an employee could have to work from home based on the type of work they do. The flexibility for an individual job is up to the manager for each position and the operational requirements. Employees also have the right to work full-time from the office if they prefer. All of our roles require at least some in-person time.

IBEW/Field – No option to work from home

Resident – Works primarily (4+ days per week) in the office.

Hybrid – May be able to work from home up to 3 days per week.

Remote – Works from home 4+ days per week



LifeGuard App & How it works



When someone is about to use, especially alone, they can open the app and record the type of substance they are using and confirm their location. The app will hold this information, and a timer is set which can be paused or extended by the app user at any time.

As the timer ends, the app will sound an alarm, flash a light, and vibrate. The user must hit a button to stop the alarm and indicate they are fine. If they are unable to stop the alarm, a text-to-voice call will go straight to 9-1-1. This alerts emergency medical dispatchers.

Seeking vessel services for targeted trapping of juvenile crabs

The Vancouver Fraser Port Authority (port authority) is executing a pilot study field sampling program between July and October 2023 and is seeking vessel services to support the trapping of juvenile crabs as part of the juvenile Dungeness crab nursery habitat follow-up program pilot study.

Field work details

Field work for the 2023 pilot study will involve the following vessel-based sampling:

- Targeted trapping of larger juvenile Dungeness crabs (*Metacarcinus magister*) (30 mm - 120 mm carapace width) using modified fishing traps (e.g., shrimp and "Gee" style minnow traps); and
- Collection of water quality measurements using a hand-held meter.

Targeted trapping will occur between 20 and 30 locations, including on the north side of the Roberts Bank causeway and in the inter-causeway area. Field sampling will be carried out over up to 16 field days (non-consecutive) ranging in length from 6 to 8 hours per day, for a total up to 128 hours. Field sampling will be carried out during high-tide events and within shallow subtidal (e.g., between 0m and -3m chart datum [CD]) channel and eelgrass habitat.

Timing

Field work will be carried out between July and October 2023 and may include weekend and evening sampling, depending on weather and tides.

Requirements for the vessel and its operator

Qualified vendors and operators must have the following requirements:

- Large deck / workspace
- Mechanical assist with capability of deploying and recovering fishing trap sets weighing up to 200 lbs; an appropriately rated and recently inspected winch and A-frame/crane/davit is preferred
- Must be appropriately certified by Transport Canada to operate vessel commercially
- Experienced crew
- Must possess sufficient insurance to operate commercially within the Port of Vancouver, as per the field program's Marine Event Permit, as well as Workers' Compensation Board (WCB) paperwork as required
- Vessel operation/job safety procedure and practices, and the ability to accommodate additional safety requirements as specified by WSP Golder
- Ability to work collaboratively with the team of one Indigenous technician and one member of the port authority's technical team
- Ability to provide services for the full duration of the program, including up to 16 full days (non-consecutive), between July and October 2023

Having capacity to provide the services of an Indigenous Environmental Technician to support in completing field studies is also required. The Indigenous Environmental Technician would be responsible for supporting the field team in completing all aspects of the field work, including trap deployment/retrieval, processing of catch, water quality measurements and data recording in accordance with established health and safety procedures. The PROJECT:

This project is an opportunity for **5 ARTISTS** to create art that will be showcased on the windscreens adjacent to the car doors in the NEW SkyTrain Mark 5 train cars, which will be launched in 2025. Vinyl decals will be applied by the SkyTrain car manufacturer, Alstom, before delivery to TransLink (refer to appendices). The artists' designs will be viewed by SkyTrain customers sitting or standing alongside them as well as in other areas of the cars. Artists are invited to create designs that speak to their experiences as Indigenous people, and which are inviting and engaging when viewed both up close and from farther away.

The ARTWORK:

Musqueam and [BC Hydro](#) have joined forces with the [Vancouver Mural Festival](#) to deliver this unique mural project during the summer of 2023.

Project Information

1. Wall Mural Objectives: This mural will honour the unceded and ancestral xʷməθkʷəy̓əm territory where the Camosun Substation is located, and contribute to the area's sense of inclusivity, well-being and cultural safety.

2. Dimensions: The wall for the mural covers **853 square feet** (26.5 feet x 32.2 feet).

3. Insurance: The selected artist will be required to obtain their own insurance in consultation with VMF.

4. Timeline: The artist will be selected by June 27, 2023. There will be **at least a month available for design creation**. The mural will be painted within the month of August 2023. The VMF project team will work with the selected artist from the beginning to the end of the project.

5. Artist Fee: There is a budget of **\$6,300** to pay an artist for a mural design. To receive this fee, the selected artist is responsible for the **mural design only**. Due to the safety and technical requirements of the substation site, VMF is sub-contracting commercially-certified painters to execute the mural. The timeline, project milestones, and payment schedule will be agreed upon in a contract to be finalized upon selection of the artist.

6. Artist Selection: The artists will be selected by a panel of representatives from Musqueam Indian Band. A representative from BC Hydro will attend to provide context and answer questions. The meeting will be facilitated by VMF.

Artist Eligibility

All submissions must meet the Artist Eligibility Criteria to be considered by the selection panel:

- All xʷməθkʷəy̓əm artists are eligible to apply
- Experience in creating traditional Coast Salish/Musqueam art and design
- No experience in mural making is necessary


