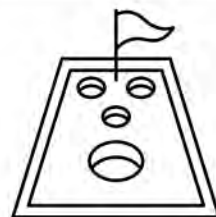

Threading Things Together: Salish weaving's resurgence in the 1960s

Salish weaving is alive and thriving in many communities today. Alison is studying how weaving was renewed in Stó:lō communities near Sardis in the 1960s. She is focussing on the work of four early weavers, Martha James, Adeline Lorenzetto, Mary Peters and Anabel Stewart. Working with contemporary weavers, archives and collections together creates a more complete picture of how these women brought weaving back into the daily lives of their families and communities.

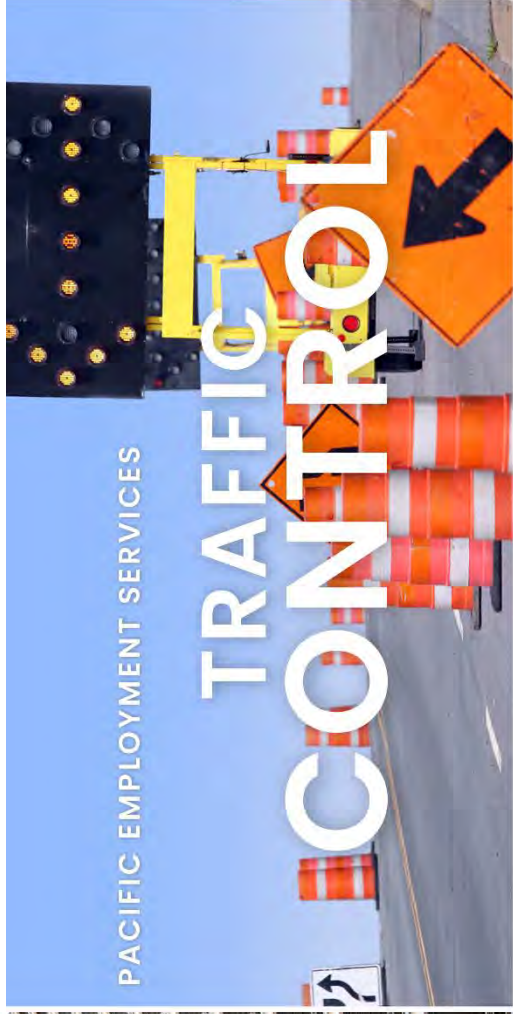

Lots of people are getting sick this season. It could be a cold, the flu, or COVID-19. If you're not feeling well — no matter what virus you have — help stop the spread.

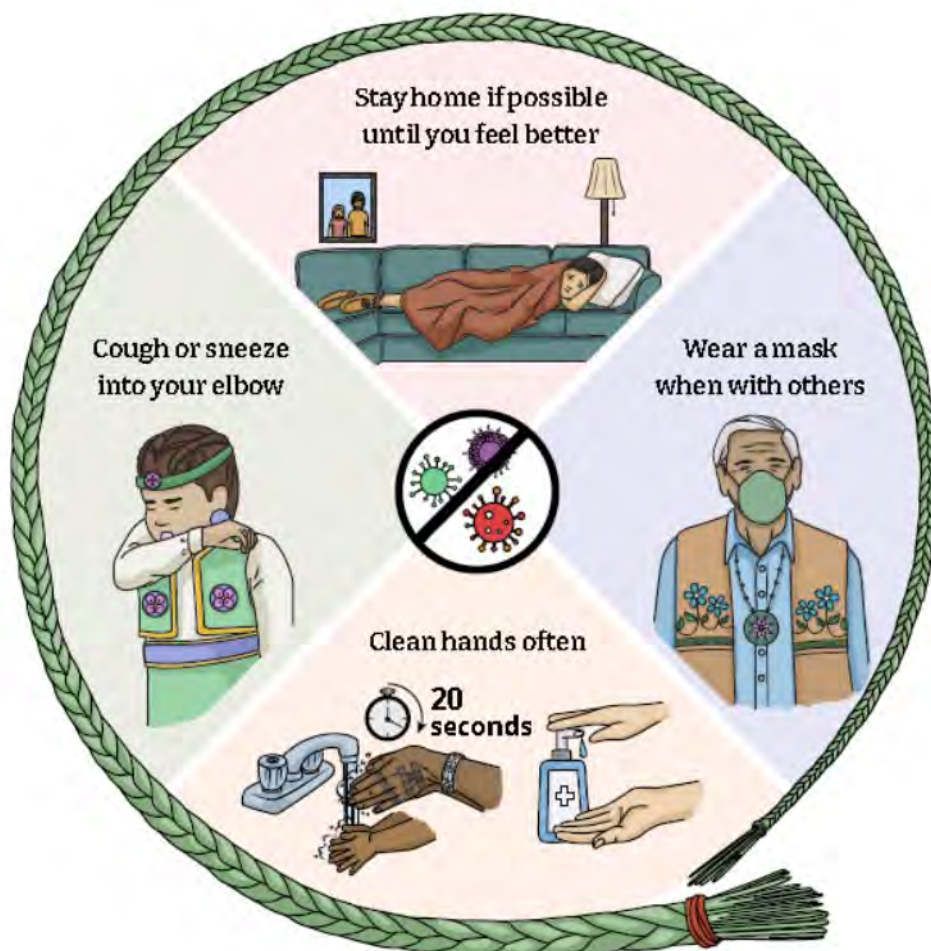

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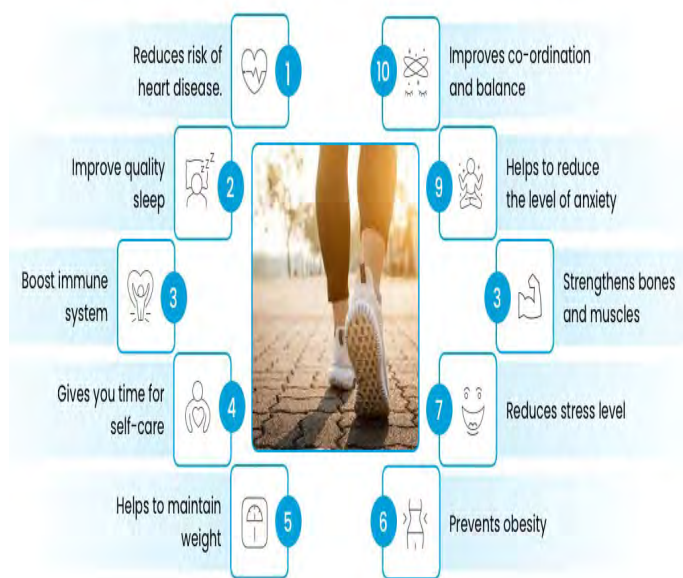

SAFE DRINKING WATER MONITORING PROGRAM

Charlene Campbell-Wood

The Protocol for Safe Drinking Water in First Nations Communities contains standards for design, construction, operation, maintenance, and monitoring of drinking water systems and is intended for use by First Nations staff responsible for water systems. It is also intended for use by Indian and Northern Affairs Canada (INAC) staff, Public Works and Government Services Canada (PWGSC) for INAC staff, and all others involved in providing advice or assistance to First Nations in the design, construction, operation, maintenance, and monitoring of their drinking water systems in their communities, in accordance with established federal or provincial standards, whichever are the most stringent.

Any water system that produces drinking water destined for human consumption, that is funded in whole or in part by INAC, and that serves five or more households or a public facility, must comply with the requirements of this protocol.

LifeGuard App & How it works

When someone is about to use, especially alone, they can open the app and record the type of substance they are using and confirm their location. The app will hold this information, and a timer is set which can be paused or extended by the app user at any time.

As the timer ends, the app will sound an alarm, flash a light, and vibrate. The user must hit a button to stop the alarm and indicate they are fine. If they are unable to stop the alarm, a text-to-voice call will go straight to 9-1-1. This alerts emergency medical dispatchers.
