



Prior to joining Musqueam, she worked as health director at the Haida Health Centre/Niisla Naay Healing House for six years, and within social work for over 25 years.

Monica obtained her Bachelors of Social Work from UBC and Masters in Leadership from Trinity Western University. She is also trained in Indigenous coaching, trauma, recovery, grief and suicide intervention.

The majority of her work has been advocating and negotiating for adequate services for Indigenous peoples in health and social services.

In her free time, Monica enjoy weaving in cedar, ravens tail, and chilkat, as well as gathering and preserving traditional medicines. She danced in a Haida group for 22 years, is a mask dancer and have a love of learning new things.
