



Call for Artwork

CLBC is a crown corporation of the BC government with approximately 30 offices around the province. Our organization provides funding for services for adults living with developmentally disabilities, and we promote community Inclusion, connection & belonging.

As our main office is situated on the traditional and unceded territory of the Musqueam peoples, we believe as a part of CLBC reconciliation journey it is essential to recognize and honor the unique landscape, water, and culture of this land through the placement of artwork that reflects and celebrates the rich culture of Musqueam Nation. We are looking for a piece of artwork to install in our main office which is located at 1200 West 73rd Ave. Vancouver, BC.

This artist call is open to professional or accomplished Indigenous visual artists who are supported by, or members of the Musqueam community.

CLBC welcomes submissions in two-dimensional and three-dimensional mediums including sculpture, painting, photography, digital art, and drawing.

All artwork(s) must:

- Be unique, original, and made by the artist(s)
- Be created within the past 3 years (i.e., dated 2021 or later)
- Be ready to hang and/or display

The artists chosen to deliver final designs will receive an artist's fee of \$5,000.00.

The Indigenous Advisory Committee and the Elders Advisory Committee will be selecting the artwork for each of the office locations.

Deadline for response by interested artists (by 5 pm PST) December 16, 2024. Review of applications and selected artist will be notified.

Photo entries can be submitted through email (address below) and include the following: Artist biography or summary of experience; Full contact information; digital image files and/or online links.

The Indigenous Relations team will also work with the Nations involved to ensure that the proper protocols are in place to honour the artwork being installed, as such funding will be provided for a ceremony.
