

# Call for Musqueam Crab Harvesters: Demos on Pop-up Floats Crab Harvesting Gear

Musqueam is seeking participants for the demonstration of pop-up float gear at Roberts Bank. This two-day session enables Musqueam and Tsawwassen FSC crab harvesters to learn about new technologies, share impressions, and inform a study in 2026.

The future study is a joint effort between the Vancouver Fraser Port Authority (VFPA), Musqueam Indian Band, Tsawwassen First Nation, and Fisheries and Oceans Canada (DFO) to investigate methods and technologies to allow access for Musqueam and Tsawwassen to harvest crab in the navigational closure areas at Roberts Bank while adhering to DFO and VFPA regulations.



# Call for Musqueam Vessel Operators: Demos on Pop-up Floats

The Vancouver Fraser Port Authority, in collaboration with Musqueam Indian Band, Tsawwassen First Nation, and Fisheries and Oceans Canada, is conducting a demonstration of pop-up float (on-demand) crab harvesting gear in June 2025 as part of the regulatory requirements of the Roberts Bank Terminal 2 project (RBT2 or project).

We are seeking vessel services to support the demonstration of pop-up float gear at Roberts Bank to harvesters from Musqueam and Tsawwassen communities who currently harvest crab for domestic or food, social, and ceremonial, (FSC) purposes. The purpose of the demonstration is to have FSC crab harvesters learn about the technologies, share their impressions, and inform planning of the study to follow in 2026.

#### What to expect

Following an information session in a classroom setting on June 3, 2025, the vessel-based portion of the demo will include pick-up of participants and gear at an agreed-upon location, navigation to waters off Roberts Bank, demonstration and trialing of gear at Roberts Bank, and return of participants and gear. The in-water demo will occur on June 4, 2025, from approximately 10 am to 3 pm inclusive of pick-up and drop-off of participants.

- Mechanical assist with capability of deploying and recovering crab traps weighing up to 200 lbs; an appropriately rated and recently inspected winch and A-frame/crane/davit is preferred
- Must be appropriately certified by Transport Canada to operate vessel commercially
- Experienced operator/crew
- Must possess sufficient insurance to operate commercially within the Port of Vancouver, as per the field program's Marine Event Permit, as well as Workers' Compensation Board (WCB) paperwork as required
- Vessel operation / job safety procedure and practices, and the ability to accommodate additional safety requirements as specified by Vancouver Fraser Port Authority
- Ability to work collaboratively with up to three representatives of the manufacturers of the pop-up floats gear
- Ability to provide services for the full duration of the day

# Musqueam Creek Contamination Investigation Update

### Dye Testing

Over the next few months, the City of Vancouver will be conducting dye testing of sewers servicing Salish Drive residences north of Stautlo Ave.

As a result, green and/or red dye may be briefly seen flowing into Musqueam and Cutthroat Creeks southeast of Salish Drive. The dye is not harmful to the creeks, humans, fish, or other wildlife.

The purpose of this testing is to pinpoint any failing plumbing/infrastructure leaking sewage into the creeks. It is part of ongoing efforts by Musqueam to identify and address pollution of Musqueam Creek.

# Cultural Burn Site FireSmart Documentary- Request for Proposals

# May 2, 2024 PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Musqueam Administration is seeking proposals from artists for a short-documentary video project that will discuss the FireSmart enhancement of the cultural burn site.

Musqueam Administration is presenting an opportunity to Musqueam Filmmaker(s) to write, direct, and create a short (5-10 minute) documentary feature that will detail the FireSmart project and the ongoing development of the burn site. The FireSmart upgrades will help to ensure that the cultural burn site and the area around it can be safely used year-round. The scope of work for the FireSmarting will include the construction of a cement barrier around the northwest side of the site, brushing around the site and spreading gravel. As a part of this work, Musqueam has received funding for a short documentary video that can be used for social media marketing that will detail the impacts of the upgrades, as well as share with community members how they will support fire safety and preparedness in the community.

Musqueam Administration is seeking a talented and creative Musqueam Filmmaker(s) interested in creating this short documentary project. The documentary is intended to show Musqueam's excitement for the advancement of the burn site's FireSmart features and the ways that it will support safe burning moving forward.

#### SCOPE OF WORK

To create a short (5-10 minute) documentary feature that explains the work that has been done to the cultural burn site and the positive impacts that it will have in supporting year-round cultural burnings. Short clips of the Project may also be used for reels or teasers of the Project. It is at the discretion of the filmmaker as to how they wish to communicate this, but proposals are encouraged to be humorous, informative and creative.

This documentary project does not need to go too in-depth into the cultural significance of the area. Rather, it is intended to demonstrate the development process of the FireSmart safety features being implemented at the site and the ways in which they will support the Community.

Goals of the project are to:

- Communicate the importance of FireSmarting;
- Update community members on the work that has been done at the site; and
- Reflect the importance of the site for the Musqueam Community

#### Timespan of the Project:

- The work on the burn site will take place during the month of June/July
- The film should be ready for viewing in early August

#### BUDGET

The value for the short documentary project would not exceed \$5000 and should be inclusive of time, materials, and any additional supports for the Filmmaker.

#### CONTENT OF PROPOSAL

Artist should submit the following:

- Written resume of the Filmmaker;
- Samples of previous work: Reel of previous projects, links to other works, or a specific project that the Filmmaker feels supports their application;
- · Names and contact information of two (2) references;
- Written outline of the Filmmaker's concept for and description of the documentary project (not to exceed 500 words) that includes:
  - Filmmakers approach to the project
  - A script or storyboard of the film
  - o The Artist's timetable for completion of writing, filming, editing and submission

#### **PROCESS**

The final selection will be made by a Selection Committee composed of personnel from Musqueam Indian Band, including one member of Council, one member of the Administration Leadership Team, and one Project Representative. The Selection Committee's decision is final and binding on all proponents who submit proposals in response to this RFP. The selection process will be facilitated by this committee. Factors that will be considered in the selection process will be:

- The Filmmaker's previous experience and works
- · The ways in which the proposed project can blend humor, information, and creativity
- The proposed project's ability to communicate FireSmart messaging



#### **ABOUT THE PROJECT**

This special game is dedicated to honouring the heritage, resilience, and contributions of the First Nations communities on whose land we live, work, and play.

#### PROJECT PURPOSE

This evening provides an opportunity to amplify First Nations voices and celebrate their rich cultures and traditions, recognizing that it is more than just a celebration—it is a reaffirmation of our commitment to truth and reconciliation. The logo created by the selected artist will be featured across all materials related to the game, including marketing assets, in-arena screens, social content, web graphics, and more.

#### SELECTION PROCESS

The project will begin with an open call to the public. #### April 28, 2025: Call for Indigenous Digital Artists/Graphic Designers

GCT Global Container Terminals is commissioning a commemorative logo created by an Indigenous graphic designer or digital artist from the x<sup>w</sup>məθkwəyəm (Musqueam Indian Band), Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw (Squamish Nation) and səlilwəta (Tsleil-Waututh Nation). This logo will commemorate GCT Vanterm's 50th year of operations and will be utilized across various platforms, including digital and print materials, promotional campaigns, and the terminal itself.

#### **Project Description**

2025 marks the 50th anniversary of GCT Vanterm's operations on the South Shore of Burrard Inlet within the Port of Vancouver and on the traditional territories of the xwməθkwəyəm (Musqueam Indian Band), Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw (Squamish Nation) and səlilwətał (Tsleil-Waututh Nation). GCT is committed to recognizing, acknowledging and incorporating our host indigenous communities' values and rich history in our projects.

To honour this occasion, GCT is planning several events, including a community open house in September. GCT seeks a commemorative 50th-anniversary logo designed to help communicate the anniversary celebration events and create a lasting creative and cultural legacy that will be applied in print and materials throughout the terminal and organization.

We are looking for a logo design that thoughtfully reflects GCT's Safety, Pride, and Professionalism values and incorporates some GCT brand elements. It should also showcase our host Indigenous communities' rich maritime and stewardship roles and history. The goal is to create a logo that acknowledges shared values of stewardship and safety and celebrates the trade pathways that have been a sustaining part of Burrard Inlet.

We invite proposals from Indigenous graphic designers and digital artists who:

- Have experience in brand identity design, including logo development and visual storytelling.
- Can provide a portfolio of samples of past work demonstrating creativity and cultural awareness.
- Can provide output in digital format.
- Understand and respect Indigenous visual representation and storytelling principles.
- Have experience collaborating with organizations, businesses, or communities on professional design projects.
- Member of Musqueam, Squamish, or Tsleil-Watuth Nations.
- Can commit to completing the project by June 30, 2025.





#### Scope of Work

The selected designer(s) will be responsible for:

- Developing a new logo that is easily replicated in multiple media and is delivered as a digital, vector file
- Incorporating feedback from the project team and committee and ensuring alignment with project goals.
- Delivering final assets in required formats by June 30, 2025.

- Sample work or portfolio: A selection of past work showcasing relevant design work and your style and experience. (up to 5 pieces)

- Proposal Concept: A short description or initial sketch of your concept (optional but encouraged)

#### Langara Falcon Indigenous Stylized Logo Project - Artist Call

#### Introduction

Langara Athletics and Campus Recreation is seeking to create an additional Falcon logo that reflects the College's meaningful relationship with Musqueam. This logo may be featured on athletic team uniforms, apparel, merchandise, promotional materials, and digital platforms such as websites and social media.

This project offers a valuable opportunity to highlight and raise awareness of the longstanding relationship between Musqueam and Langara College. Since 1970, Langara College Athletics has proudly identified with the "Falcon" as the mascot of its teams and programs.

#### Scope of Work

Langara College – sneweyet lelem – invites original concept submissions from aspiring and established Musqueam artists. The commissioned work will result in a stylized Falcon logo grounded in Musqueam art and culture.

At this stage, we are seeking preliminary concept sketches only (see submission requirements below). If an artist is selected, they will work collaboratively with Langara's selection committee to develop the final logo and provide a vectorized, production-ready graphic.

The selected artist will be expected to:

- Attend 1 to 3 working group meetings with the Langara Committee
- Collaborate on the development of usage guidelines for the logo

#### Artist Call – Submission Requirements

We invite Musqueam artists to submit a proposal that includes the following:

#### 1. Artist Biography

A short biography or summary of your artistic background.

#### 2. Design Proposal

Preliminary concept sketches or drawings that incorporate Musqueam traditions and art into the Falcon logo. Finalized artwork is not required at this stage.

#### 3. Vision Statement (Only required for the final logo)

A 50–200 word (maximum) statement describing your artistic intent, the significance of your design, and how it reflects themes relevant to Musqueam and Langara.

#### 4. Theme Consideration

Designs should consider themes such as activity, sport, community, and connection from a Musqueam perspective.

#### 5. Optional - Work Samples

As an option, you may send up to 5 images (maximum) of past work. Please include the title, medium, dimensions, date, and a short description for each image.

# Please do not send original or one-of-a-kind artworks as submissions, just in case they get damaged or lost.

#### Selection Process

A committee of Langara College representatives — including Indigenous members from departments such as Indigenous Education and Services, and Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion — will evaluate submissions based on:

- Artistic merit
- Storytelling
- Quality of the artwork

A shortlist of artists will be selected based on the quality of their submission and alignment with the project vision. We anticipate shortlisting 2–3 artists for final consideration.

Shortlisted artists will receive a \$300 stipend as compensation for their time and effort in developing and submitting their concept designs.

The final artist will be chosen from this shortlist and will work collaboratively with the committee throughout the design and production phases.

#### **Contract Value**

\$10,000

This fee will be paid upon completion of the final design and submission of logo usage suggestions to be incorporated into a style and brand guide. Additional costs related to production and use of the logo will be covered separately by the College. If the artwork is used beyond its original scope, further compensation will be discussed.

The Artist Fee is \$5000.00.


