#### həyqw (fire) ban in Musqueam

All open fires are currently banned in Musqueam Reserve and throughout the region.

The only fires that are permitted are controlled, propane fire-pits.

This fire ban aligns with BC Wildfire Service's restrictions for the Coastal Fire Centre region of the province, which Musqueam is within.

The following types of fires are banned:



Backyard fires (open fire): A fire bigger than 1'8" (one foot, eight inches) in height and in width and is used by any person for recreational purpose, or by a First Nation for a ceremonial purpose



Campfires (semi-closure): A fire bigger than 1'8" (one foot, eight inches) in height and in width and is used by any person for recreational purpose



River fires (open fire): Bigger than a backyard fire, close to a dry, grassy area



#### MUSQUEAM SANITARY SEWER REPAIR

Musqueam Creek Sanitary Sewer Rehabilitation project is scheduled to begin in the first week of August/2025. This important project is expected to take approximately three months to complete. This is a project needed to continue to provide sanitary services to the community.

To ensure the safety of both community members and construction workers, access to the Musqueam Creek area will be closed for the duration of the construction period.




## Reconciling by Larry Grant will be released on Sept. 9!





#### Welcome to the clinic, Molly!

Molly McGillis is thrilled to be joining the Musqueam Health Team as a part-time Nurse Practitioner in October. Originally from Ottawa, Molly began her academic journey with a Bachelor of Science in Global Health at the University of Toronto. She subsequently spent time in sub-Saharan Africa, which opened her eyes to the real-life impacts of the social determinants of health and sparked a desire to pursue a more hands-on role in healthcare. That led her straight into nursing school, also at the University of Toronto.



Since becoming a registered nurse, Molly has worked in community mental health, respite care for street-involved people, and in the ICU. Eventually, the call of the North took her to Dene land in the Northwest Territories, where she worked as a community health nurse in Behchokỳ. Working in an Indigenous community during the pandemic, she witnessed the strength of the community and its resilience in the face of hardship and health inequities. She learned a great deal about Indigenous ways of healing and was inspired to expand her skills even further—leading her to pursue her Master of Nursing and become a Nurse Practitioner.

Molly graduated from the University of British Columbia's NP program in 2024 and has been working in family practice in West Vancouver since. She is passionate about women's health and sustainable healthcare practices. When she's not in clinic, you can usually find her on her bike, tending to her plants, or elbow deep in a crochet project.

She is truly honoured to be a guest on the unceded territory of the Musqueam People and looks forward to learning from and with the community.


