## **hə'ýq<sup>w</sup> (fire) ban in Musqueam**

All open fires are currently banned in Musqueam Reserve and throughout the region.

The only fires that are permitted are controlled, propane fire-pits.

This fire ban aligns with BC Wildfire Service's restrictions for the Coastal Fire Centre region of the province, which Musqueam is within.

The following types of fires are banned:



Backyard fires (open fire): A fire bigger than 1'8" (one foot, eight inches) in height and in width and is used by any person for recreational purpose, or by a First Nation for a ceremonial purpose



Campfires (semi-closure): A fire bigger than 1'8" (one foot, eight inches) in height and in width and is used by any person for recreational purpose



River fires (open fire): Bigger than a backyard fire, close to a dry, grassy area

## **MUSQUEAM SANITARY SEWER REPAIR**

Musqueam Creek Sanitary Sewer Rehabilitation project is scheduled to begin in the first week of August/2025. This important project is expected to take approximately three months to complete. This is a project needed to continue to provide sanitary services to the community.

To ensure the safety of both community members and construction workers, access to the Musqueam Creek area will be closed for the duration of the construction period.

There may be temporary interruptions to traffic on Stautlo Avenue throughout the course of the work. These disruptions will be managed to minimize inconvenience, and signage information will be provided as needed. No road closures are expected to Stautlo Avenue. There will be no disruptions to sanitary services during construction.

We have included a map showing the location of where the work will take place. We appreciate everyone's understanding and apologize for any inconvenience during construction.

During construction there will be traffic diversions, parking restrictions and road closures. The actual work site will be kept as compact and tidy as reasonably possible. The workers will cooperate with the businesses and residents to try and minimize the impact the work will have on day-to-day business operations.

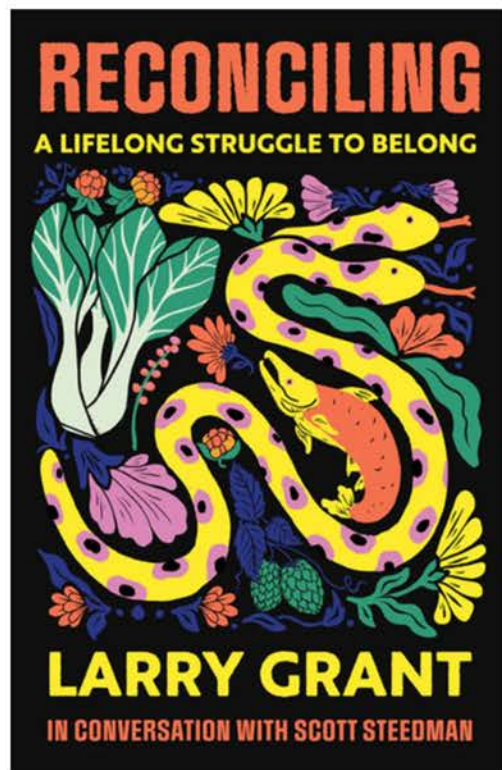
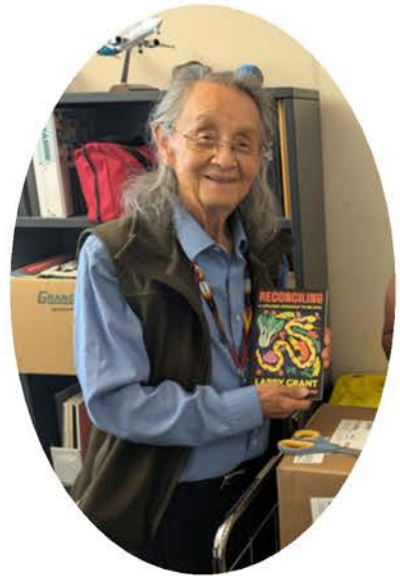


# ***Reconciling* by Larry Grant will be released on Sept. 9!**

## **About the book**

In *Reconciling*, Larry tells the story of his life, including his thoughts on reconciliation and the path forward for First Nations and Canada. His life echoes the barely known story of Vancouver.



It combines Indigenous traditions with key events of the last two centuries, including Chinese immigration and the Head Tax, the ravages of residential schools, and now Indigenous revival and the accompanying change in worldview.

Each chapter takes the form of a series of conversations between Larry and writer Scott Steedman and is built around one pivotal geographical place and its themes, including the Musqueam reserve, Chinatown, the site of the Mission Residential School, the Vancouver docks, and the University of British Columbia.

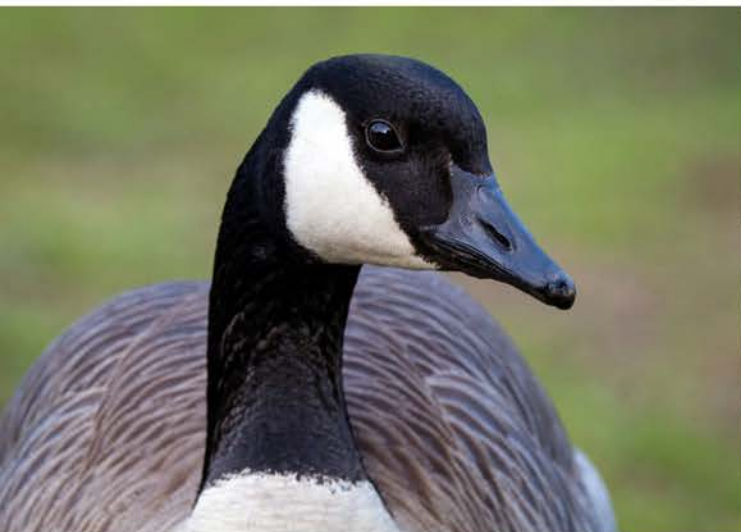

Musqueam students who are either newly admitted to or currently registered at the University of British Columbia are invited to apply to the Musqueam Scholarship.

This award was created to acknowledge the strong relationship between UBC and Musqueam. It is a community-based scholarship for students who are Musqueam Band members studying at UBC in their undergraduate, post baccalaureate (including Medicine, Dentistry, Law, Education, Pharmacy, Nursing, Midwifery, and Social Work), and graduate studies.

The award is valued up to \$5,500 annually and renewable for up to four (4) years.

Recipients will have demonstrated academic and leadership achievements including, but not limited to, engagement in the arts, athletics, school, and/or their community. Recipients will be selected on their ability to demonstrate their openness to continuing to learn who they are, where they come from, and their responsibility in enriching and carrying knowledge forward in their community and the world.

## Background

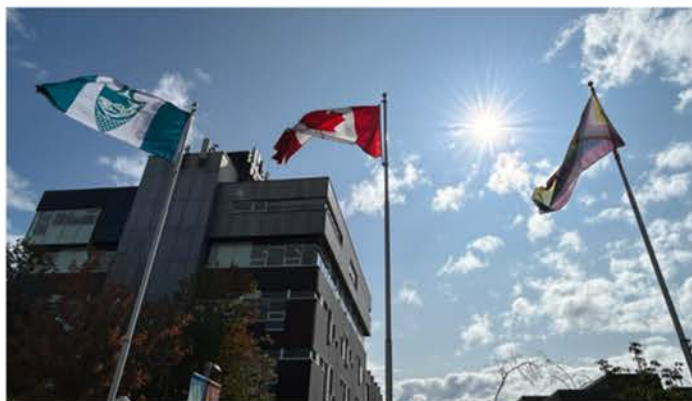
The Musqueam Tuition Waiver was included as part of the Memorandum of Agreement that Langara College and Musqueam signed in December 2023.

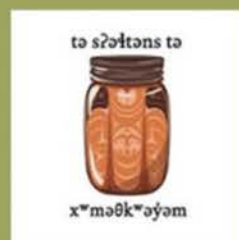

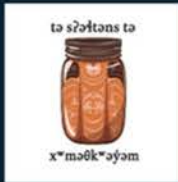

## Welcome to the clinic, Molly!

Molly McGillis is thrilled to be joining the Musqueam Health Team as a part-time Nurse Practitioner in October. Originally from Ottawa, Molly began her academic journey with a Bachelor of Science in Global Health at the University of Toronto. She subsequently spent time in sub-Saharan Africa, which opened her eyes to the real-life impacts of the social determinants of health and sparked a desire to pursue a more hands-on role in healthcare. That led her straight into nursing school, also at the University of Toronto.



Since becoming a registered nurse, Molly has worked in community mental health, respite care for street-involved people, and in the ICU. Eventually, the call of the North took her to Dene land in the Northwest Territories, where she worked as a community health nurse in Behchokò. Working in an Indigenous community during the pandemic, she witnessed the strength of the community and its resilience in the face of hardship and health inequities. She learned a great deal about Indigenous ways of healing and was inspired to expand her skills even further—leading her to pursue her Master of Nursing and become a Nurse Practitioner.

Molly graduated from the University of British Columbia's NP program in 2024 and has been working in family practice in West Vancouver since. She is passionate about women's health and sustainable healthcare practices. When she's not in clinic, you can usually find her on her bike, tending to her plants, or elbow deep in a crochet project.

She is truly honoured to be a guest on the unceded territory of the Musqueam People and looks forward to learning from and with the community.
