Musqueam Chief & Council plan to appeal *Cowichan v Canada* decision

On August 7, the Supreme Court of BC released its decision in the *Cowichan Tribes v. Canada* court case. After more than 20 months of review, trial judge Justice Young affirmed Cowichan's two claims which included:

- Aboriginal title to a part of Richmond opposite Tilbury Island within Musqueam's traditional territory
- rights to fish the south arm of the Fraser River

After significant review of the 863-page judgment and advice from external legal counsel, a number of opportunities have been identified by legal for appeal. **Chief and Council can now announce that Musqueam will appeal the decision.**

Notice to appeal must be filed by September 8, 2025. In the coming weeks, leadership, administration and legal counsel will be working to file our appeal by this deadline. We will look to host an information session for membership in the near future.

Why did council decide to appeal?

The judge's decision was deeply disappointing to Musqueam, and the heartbreak and frustration from the outcome continues to be felt throughout the community. Because this case is so important to Musqueam, leadership has been extremely deliberate about how to move forward.

Leadership and administration staff have taken the appropriate time to review and understand the judgment, its impact on Musqueam and the possible next steps. Part of the review process Chief and Council undertook involved fully understanding the right strategy for appeal and the potential grounds for appeal that would be accepted by an appellate court.

Chief and Council met frequently with legal counsel over the past two weeks to discuss Musqueam's options for filing notice to appeal. On August 22, council approved a motion to move forward with an appeal.

Ever since colonial contact and especially since the Indian Act was imposed, Musqueam has worked to restore our sovereignty and self-determination through the courts, negotiations and direct action.

We have long been at the forefront of championing Indigenous rights, including through two landmark Supreme Court of Canada cases in the past 50 years: *Guerin v The Queen* (1984) and *R v Sparrow* (1990).

Appealing *the Cowichan Tribes v. Canada* decision is another step in this long history of protecting our rights, including title to our lands and fishing rights in the Fraser River.

Background about the case

In 2014, four Vancouver Island First Nations — Cowichan Tribes, Stz'uminus, Penelakut, and Halalt, also on behalf of Lyackson — filed an Aboriginal title lawsuit claiming approximately 1,900 acres of Crown land on Lulu Island in Richmond, BC. They assert this area was a significant village and fishing site which was excluded from their reserve lands.

Musqueam joined as a defendant in 2016, joining Tsawwassen First Nation, City of Richmond, Vancouver Fraser Port Authority, Province of British Columbia and Canada.

The plaintiffs' claim targets Crown and municipal land, and seeks recognition of Aboriginal title to the lands and fishing rights to the south arm of the Fraser River. The trial, which was the longest ever in Canada at 513 trial days, concluded in November 2023. Justice Young released the decision on August 7, 2025 ruling in favour of the plaintiffs.

FISH WASTE AROUND MUSQUEAM

Fishing season is here and we are thrilled to see our fishers out on the water and community members processing fish. We'd like to remind everyone:

Please be respectful of our teachings, territory, community and neighbours when disposing of fish waste.

There have been numerous reports of rotting fish remains, abandoned totes and associated trash around Musqueam, specifically:

- at the foreshore by the boat ramp and slough
- around the dumpster
- in the creeks and ditches
- next to the burn site where sensitive cultural work happens
- behind the maintenance shed on Salish Drive
- on top of the cultural centre after being picked up and dropped by birds



COMMUNITY NOTICE

FISH WASTE AROUND MUSQUEAM

Rotting fish are not only horrible to see and smell, but can be harmful or even deadly to dogs if consumed.

Careless disposal of fish remains goes against one of our core cultural values of respecting the fish we harvest that have sustained us for millennia.

Please be mindful of everyone who lives here and dispose of your waste responsibly. Let's work together to keep Musqueam a beautiful place.

How to safely dispose of fish remains

Please get rid of fish waste (trimmings, guts, heads, bones etc.) directly into the slough during hightide.

Lift the remains over the railing and dump directly into the water so that it washes away from the foreshore.

Avoid dumping at the boat ramp or at low tide, as the remains will wash ashore and rot on the beach.





hə'ýq^w (fire) ban in Musqueam

All open fires are currently banned in Musqueam Reserve and throughout the region.

The only fires that are permitted are controlled, propane fire-pits.

This fire ban aligns with BC Wildfire Service's restrictions for the Coastal Fire Centre region of the province, which Musqueam is within.

The following types of fires are banned:



Backyard fires (open fire): A fire bigger than 1'8" (one foot, eight inches) in height and in width and is used by any person for recreational purpose, or by a First Nation for a ceremonial purpose



Campfires (semi-closure): A fire bigger than 1'8" (one foot, eight inches) in height and in width and is used by any person for recreational purpose



River fires (open fire): Bigger than a backyard fire, close to a dry, grassy area

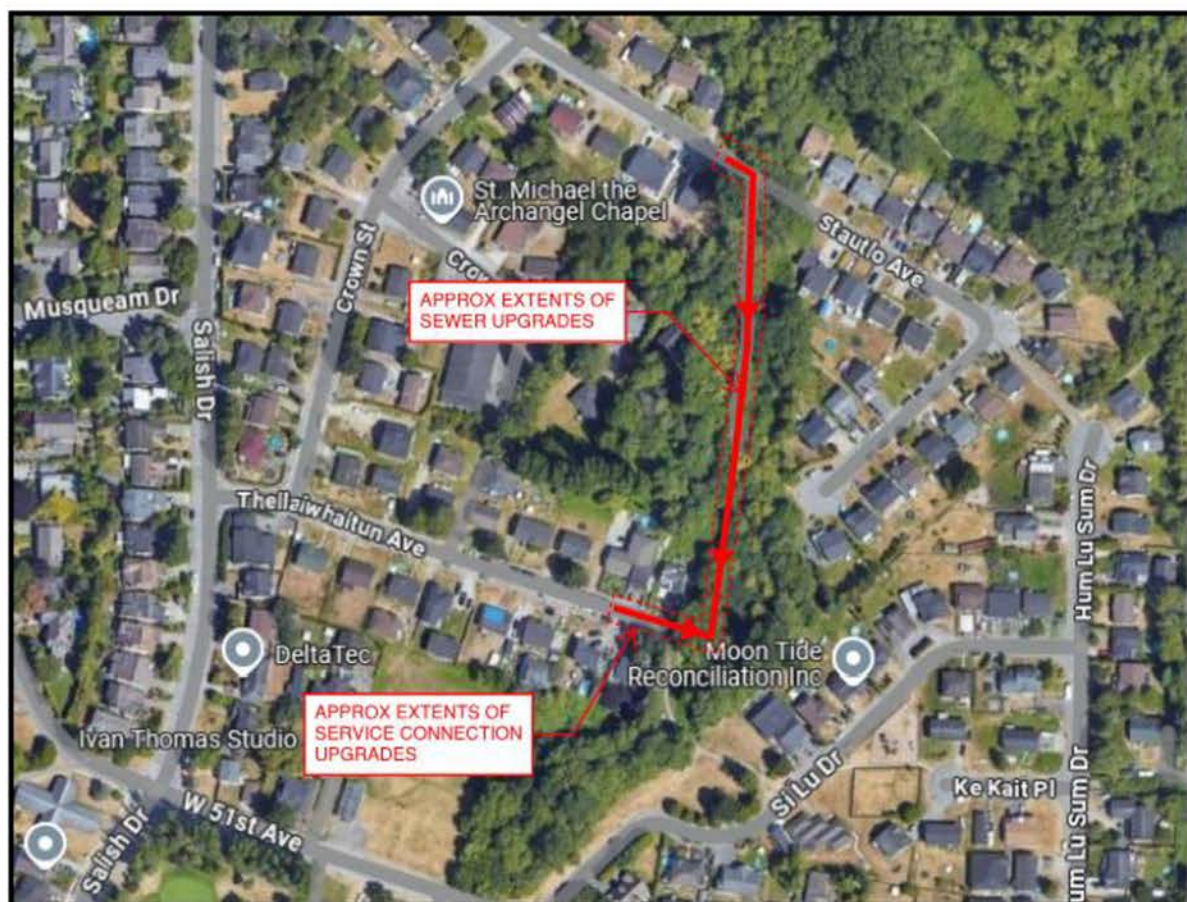
MUSQUEAM SANITARY SEWER REPAIR

Musqueam Creek Sanitary Sewer Rehabilitation project is scheduled to begin in the first week of August/2025. This important project is expected to take approximately three months to complete. This is a project needed to continue to provide sanitary services to the community.

To ensure the safety of both community members and construction workers, access to the Musqueam Creek area will be closed for the duration of the construction period.

There may be temporary interruptions to traffic on Stautlo Avenue throughout the course of the work. These disruptions will be managed to minimize inconvenience, and signage information will be provided as needed. No road closures are expected to Stautlo Avenue. There will be no disruptions to sanitary services during construction.

We have included a map showing the location of where the work will take place. We appreciate everyone's understanding and apologize for any inconvenience during construction.

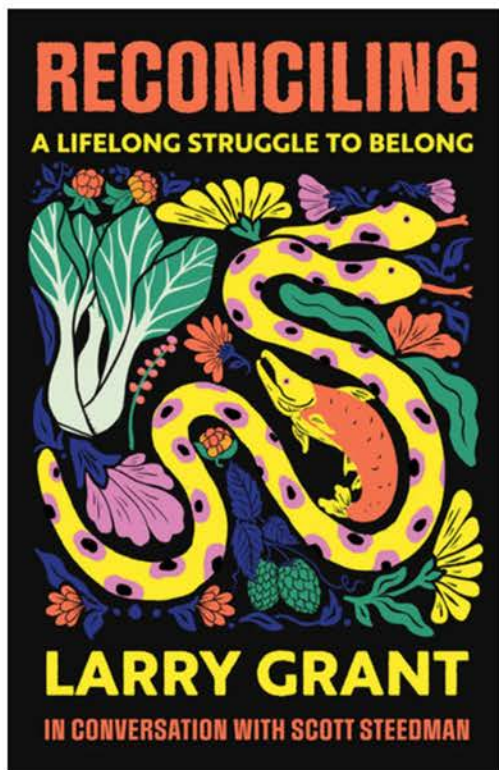


***Reconciling* by Larry Grant will be released on Sept. 9!**

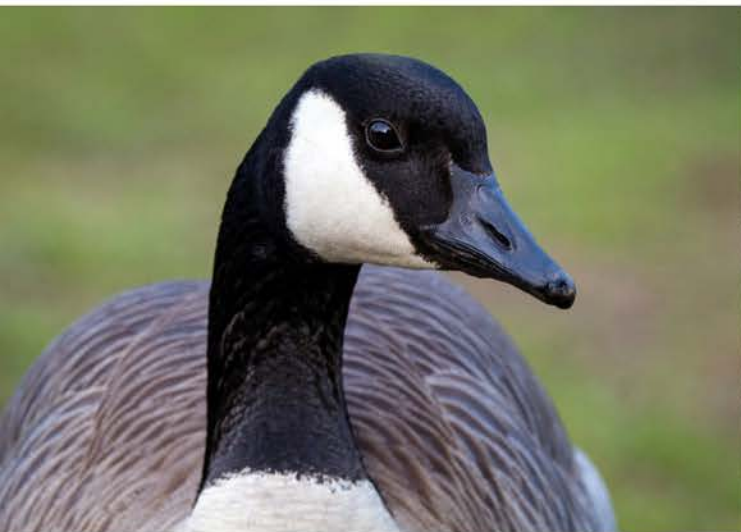

Background

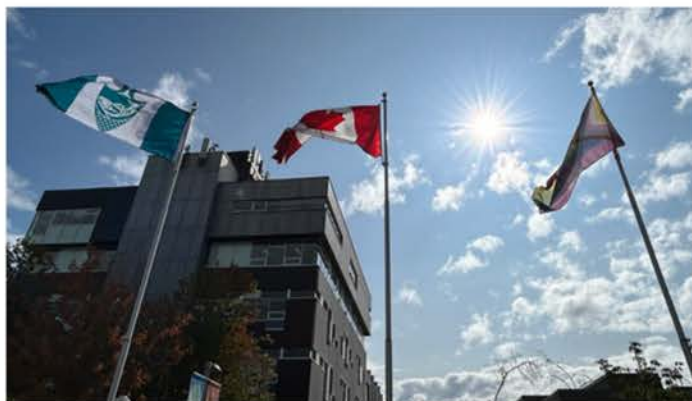
The Musqueam Tuition Waiver was included as part of the Memorandum of Agreement that Langara College and Musqueam signed in December 2023.
