



About the book

In Reconciling, Larry tells the story of his life, including his thoughts on reconciliation and the path forward for First Nations and Canada. His life echoes the barely known story of Vancouver.



It combines Indigenous traditions with key events of the last two centuries, including Chinese immigration and the Head Tax, the ravages of residential schools, and now Indigenous revival and the accompanying change in worldview.

Each chapter takes the form of a series of conversations between Larry and writer Scott Steedman and is built around one pivotal geographical place and its themes, including the Musqueam reserve, Chinatown, the site of the Mission Residential School, the Vancouver docks, and the University of British Columbia.







UBC Musqueam Scholarship now accepting applications!

UBC

Musqueam students who are either newly admitted to or currently registered at the University of British Columbia are invited to apply to the Musqueam Scholarship.

This award was created to acknowledge the strong relationship between UBC and Musqueam. It is a community-based scholarship for students who are Musqueam Band members studying at UBC in their undergraduate, post baccalaureate (including Medicine, Dentistry, Law, Education, Pharmacy, Nursing, Midwifery, and Social Work), and graduate studies.

The award is valued up to \$5,500 annually and renewable for up to four (4) years.

Recipients will have demonstrated academic and leadership achievements including, but not limited to, engagement in the arts, athletics, school, and/or their community. Recipients will be selected on their ability to demonstrate their openness to continuing to learn who they are, where they come from, and their responsibility in enriching and carrying knowledge forward in their community and the world.

Deadline to apply is September 19, 2025.

The application includes a 500-700 word personal statement and two references.

Musqueam Tuition Waiver

Background

The Musqueam Tuition Waiver was included as part of the Memorandum of Agreement that Langara College and Musqueam signed in December 2023.

This MOA is a formal way of honouring the relationship between Langara College and Musqueam and builds upon all the decades of work done by the College and the community.

The waiver covers tuition and student fees; it is available for students who are Registered Musqueam Band Members and are enrolled or planning on enrolling in full or part-time Regular or Continuing studies at the college.

Waiver eligibility

- Langara student registered in Regular or Continuing studies
- Registered Musqueam Band member
- Maintain a CGPA of 2.0

həyqw (fire) ban in Musqueam

All open fires are currently banned in Musqueam Reserve and throughout the region.

The only fires that are permitted are controlled, propane fire-pits.

This fire ban aligns with BC Wildfire Service's restrictions for the Coastal Fire Centre region of the province, which Musqueam is within.

The following types of fires are banned:



Backyard fires (open fire): A fire bigger than 1'8" (one foot, eight inches) in height and in width and is used by any person for recreational purpose, or by a First Nation for a ceremonial purpose



Campfires (semi-closure): A fire bigger than 1'8" (one foot, eight inches) in height and in width and is used by any person for recreational purpose



River fires (open fire): Bigger than a backyard fire, close to a dry, grassy area
