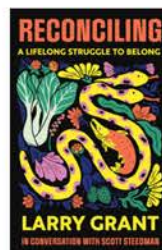

# Chief Wayne Sparrow Update

September 2025

Hello relatives, friends and members. I'm pleased to share my first update in the community newsletter about recent activities, events and meetings that I want you to know about. The goal of this update is to share some of the highlights from the past few months, and I hope to keep updating on a regular basis so members feel informed about the work happening at council and administration.

## Welcomes & Public Events

On August 12, Musqueam welcomed famed German soccer player Thomas Müller to YVR as he joins the Vancouver Whitecaps for the remainder of the 2025 season.

On August 23, Musqueam, Squamish and Tsleil-Waututh opened the first public event to view and take photos with the FIFA World Cup 2026 winner's trophy.



So far this month I've attended the grand opening of SFU's new First Peoples Gathering House, which includes a house post from Musqueam carver Lyle Sparrow. I also attended the official opening of UBC's new Recreation Centre North Building.



# Chief Update continued

## Council & Administration

In June, we welcomed our new Chief Administrative Officer Robyn McVicker, who has been learning about and working on the many different projects, partnerships, programs and services that Musqueam undertakes.

With her leadership, Musqueam is developing a 3-year strategic plan which will outline a clear vision for Musqueam's future that can guide council and administration's work. There is opportunity for Elder, staff and community input, and I look forward to seeing a final plan implemented in the coming months.

Regular council meetings were paused in August for our annual break, but work kept going, especially leading up to and after receiving the Cowichan Tribes v. Canada decision on August 7. A number of emergency meetings were called throughout August so that council could review and discuss the judgment to determine next steps with legal counsel.

There was significant media coverage in the days and weeks after the decision, and we worked to make sure Musqueam's disappointment on the outcome was included in coverage.

On August 22, we announced to community that council decided to file an appeal of the decision, and on September 5 we made an official public statement after filing the appeal.



All the other defendants are also appealing, and we have until December 8 to submit details to the court regarding the reasons for our appeal. There is a lot of work to do, but Musqueam Council is committed to protecting our ancestral rights to our lands and waters, just as our past leaders did before us.

Also on September 5, Robyn and I met with Premier David Eby to discuss reconciliation work happening between Musqueam and the Province of BC. Although we can't say too much yet, we are excited to eventually share this work with membership.

Council resumed regular meetings on September 8, and is meeting every two weeks until December. The council committees also started meeting again, and I want to thank the councillors leading these committees, as well as the band members who joined committees to ensure community's voice is represented at the table.

# Chief Update continued

## Fishing Season

Community was overjoyed that August brought an abundance of sockeye to our waters for the first time in several years.

A huge thank you to the Fisheries Department, led by acting manager Lawrence Guerin, for working hard almost every day all month. Together with the Fisheries Commission, we made sure band members received fresh fish for processing, that there were as many food fishery openings as possible, and that two years worth of fish was put away for community events.

For distributing fish to community, thank you to Darnell Campbell, Aaron Friesen and Corey Sparrow, as well as Jocelyn Campbell-Axson and Christina Nahanee who supported administratively, and Louise Point who coordinated the Elders fish distribution.

We outsourced processing for Elders that requested support with vacuum packing and canning. The filets are completed, and 9,000 lbs. of salmon is currently being canned. Elders will be notified when the fish is ready for distribution in the coming weeks.

### **Tips to prepare your home for fall & winter**



When turning on the furnace for the first time follow these steps for your safety and proper function.

- Clear area by the furnace and the vents. When vents are covered, your home won't warm up the way it should, and anything nearby could create a fire hazard.
- Check the batteries in the thermostat to see if it's working properly before you turn on the furnace.
- Check the CO2 monitor. This is an incredibly important step, as unintentionally using a damaged furnace can release toxic gas into your home, and a carbon monoxide detector will alert you to a leak immediately.
- Clean or replace the furnace filter. Housing does not provide the filters. It is the occupants responsibility to replace.
- Wipe down the burners with a cloth or a vacuum. While your furnace is on standby during the warmer seasons, the burners collect dust, which affects your furnace's lifespan. Cleaning your burners should be a part of your furnace maintenance checklist.
- Turn on the power switch. The switch location is different in each home.
- Check the breaker for the furnace and make sure the system's gas switch is on.
- Check the condenser pump. The furnace may not start because of the sensor on the pump.
- Slowly warm up the home. Quick temperature changes put unnecessary strain on your furnace. If you hear any weird noises or smell something, you should turn it off immediately.

To prolong your system's lifespan, request a furnace maintenance annually.

Call FortisBC if the furnace has an unusual smell. They will send a technician to detect if there is a gas leak.

## ***Maōri weaving, heritage, Indigenous rights, environmental change, and cultural vibrancy***
